

## Primary 1-3 Class:

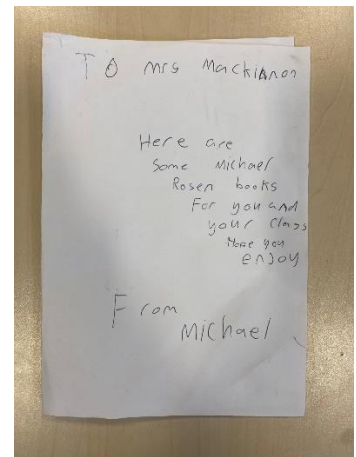
Welcome to another P1-3 class blog. I am going to start this week with an excellent share!



I never really thought I would be including Michael Maclean in my class blog again – but look!

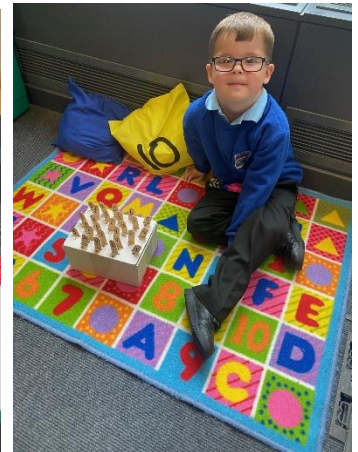
Michael thought we would like these Michael Rosen books for our classroom and has very kindly donated them.

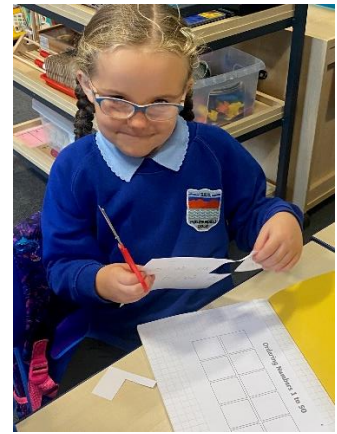


## Maths:

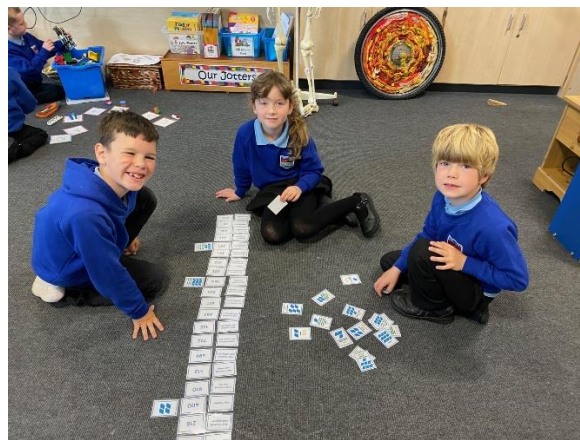
We have also been busy on Maths tasks this week. Primary one tackled some numicon puzzles!

## Alberto Giacometti:



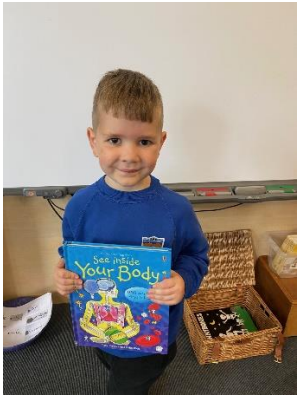

- Why doesn't skin stick to our skull? Aren't they fabulous? We will know a lot more we hope by the end of the term...

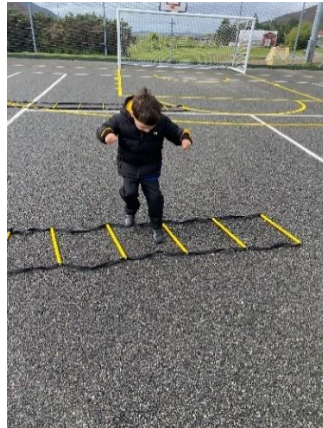
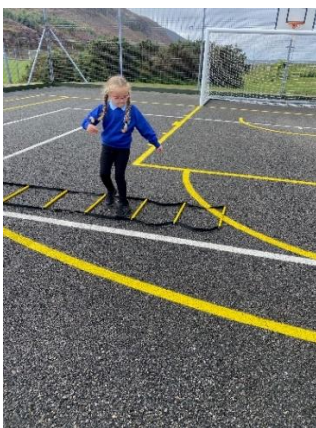


George has brought in this marvellous book that lets us take a look inside the human body. It even tells us a bit about what the body does with food. This is great because it is a question we have been pondering....
