

The older children have been working on nouns and adjectives. They searched Funnybones to find a variety of nouns. Then they had to write an adjective to describe each noun.
















Today's noun and adjective detectives are George, Autumn, Zoe, Rowan, Brooke, Elsie, Darcey and Cooper!





