It's another week in school already! I can see the year flying by.... Here we go then with a sombre start to this week's blog...


Heather Board:














Phoenix and Robert are ordering words to make sensible sounding sentences!

Winter is approaching....




Winter is almost upon is.... I think Cooper is hoping for snow.....


Look at this marvellous snowman! Cooper has made him from a sock and decorated the snowman himself!
