
DIGITAL XTRA


DEASBAD GAELIC DEBATE

Rinn iad a' chùis air Àrd-Sgoil Sheamuis Ghilleasbuig anns a' chuairt-dheireannach, a bha air a chumail ann am Pàrlamaid na h-Alba.

Airson a' chiad turais ann an eachdraidh, bha dà sgioba à Sgoil Sir E Scott anns an iar chuairt-dheireannach, an oidhche roimhe ann an Ionad Sgeulachdan na h-Alba. Chaidh an Sgioba B suas an aghaidh Sgioba A (Seamus MacAoidh agus Bella NicIlleathain), agus a-rèir aon de na britheamhan, bha strì aca gan sgaradh agus co-dhùnadh a dhèanamh air cò a dheigheadh a-steach dhan chuairt-dheireannach.

Sir E Scott School B (Ellie-Ceit Johnson and Isla Scott) were announced as winners of this year's Loganair National Gaelic Schools Debate competition in Edinburgh at the start of December.



They defeated James Gillespie's High School in the final, which was held in the Scottish Parliament.

For the first time in history, two teams from Sir E Scott School had made it through to the semi-finals, which were held the previous evening in the Scottish Storytelling Centre. The B team faced off against the A team (Seamus Mackay and Bella Maclean), and according to one of the judges, they had an incredibly difficult job in separating them and deciding on which team would go through to the final. That shows just how highly they thought of the quality of speeches and debating skills shown by both our teams.

Ultimately, it was Ellie-Ceit and Isla who won through, and following a final debate against James Gillespie's, which was at times quite fiery, it was the Harris girls who won the cup. This is the first time in history that Sir E Scott School has won the Deasbad competition, and the school and indeed the community is very proud of the four competing pupils – Ellie-Ceit, Isla, Seamus, and Bella. They represented the school fantastically, and it was mentioned by more than one person involved in the competition, how well-behaved, kind, and helpful they were.

NETBALL

The netballers have had a very busy term. The boys went up to Lewis to play the Nicolson S5 girls and unbelievably the score was level. They are after a re-match! Emma MacSween was selected to represent the Nicolson and SES team and has been quite the jet setter popping over to Inverness to play against Gordonstoun and Fettes College in the Scottish Schools Cup.
