It's the beginning of a new week so we want to get cracking with our Maths!


Robert and Phoenix are tackling a bit of subtraction using the cars to help them. Work out what one less car on the road would be....

Now for the trickier part! A little recipe card to show how we did it - coming next










































It's good to see finished results at the end of a week I always say...
