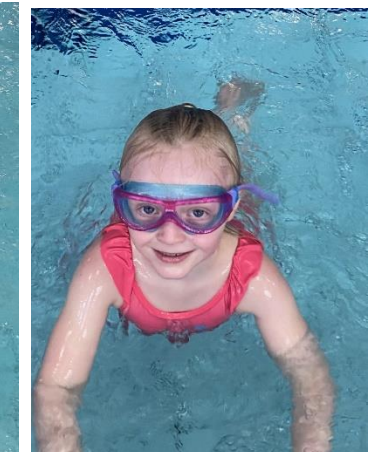


Primary 1-3 Class:

I couldn't resist taking a few snaps of some fliers today too!



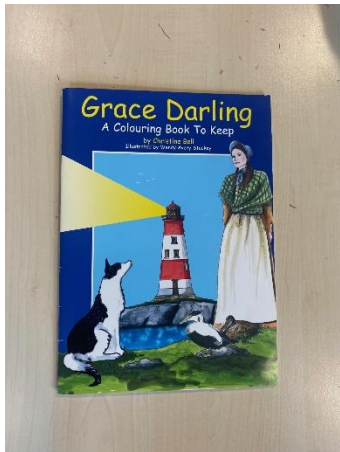
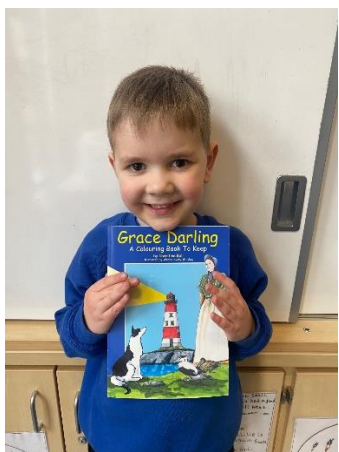
I thought it was flying fish!

More stone collecting!

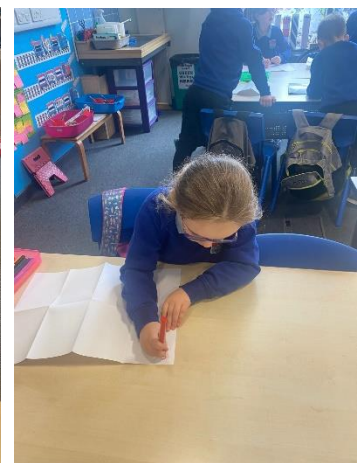
Brooke collected this stone because of its interesting shape!

Well done!

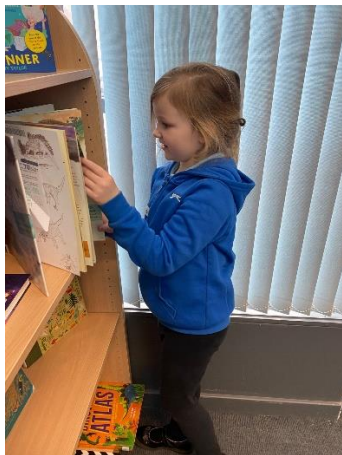
Gaelic Music:

Sumdog Western Isles!

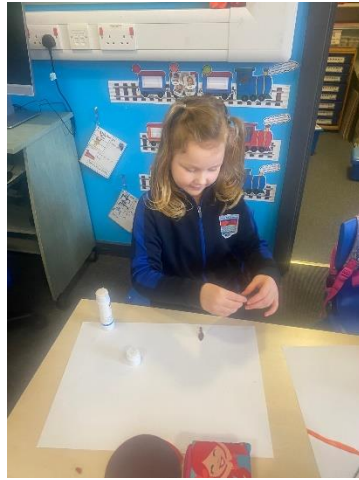
Meet our current Western Isles champions! P1-3 struck gold again with a very convincing win in the recent Sumdog Maths competition!

Pupils' Choice!

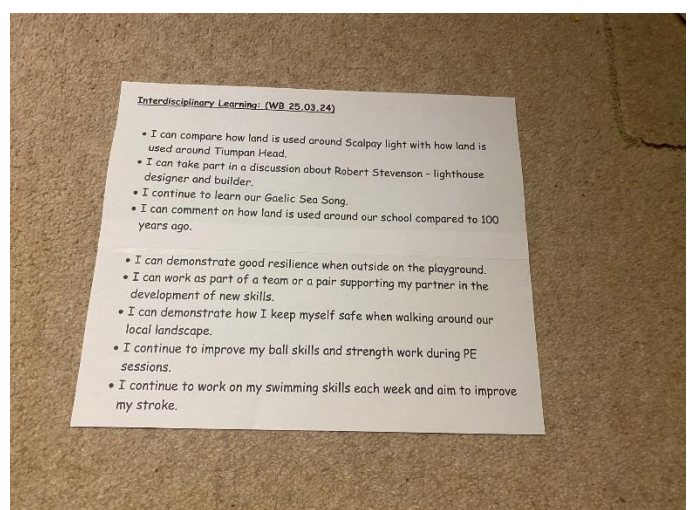
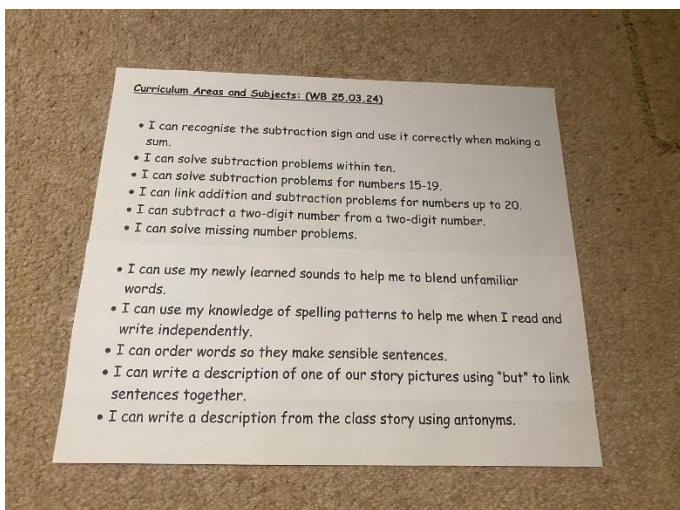
...and so it was a very tired but happy class on Friday morning! The children wanted the games and crafts as a reward for all the hard work completed during the week – and for many – last weekend too!
