
Primary 1-3 Class:

Robert and Phoenix working with numbers up to twenty. Zoe and Rowan getting to grips with Sumdog Maths;


Elsie, Autumn and Brooke are calculating some repeated addition problems...

Continuing our publication...


We continue to work on our Harris wildlife publication.... a few minutes here and there....
