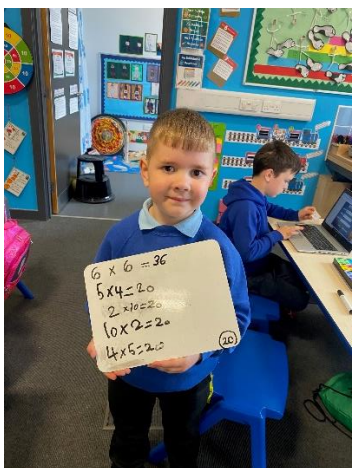
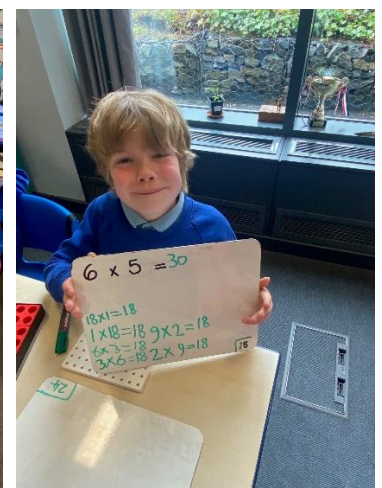
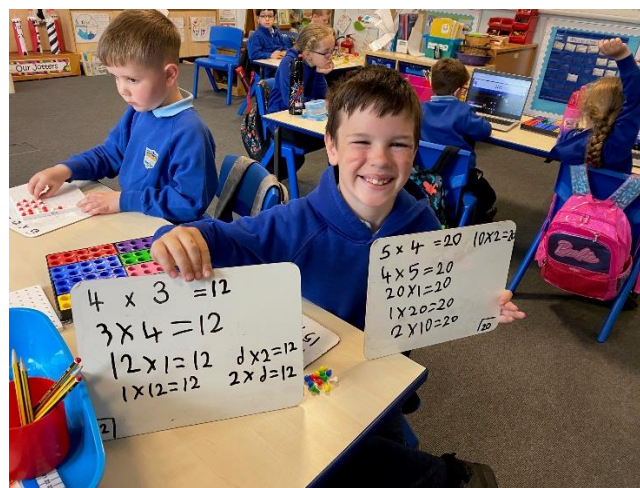
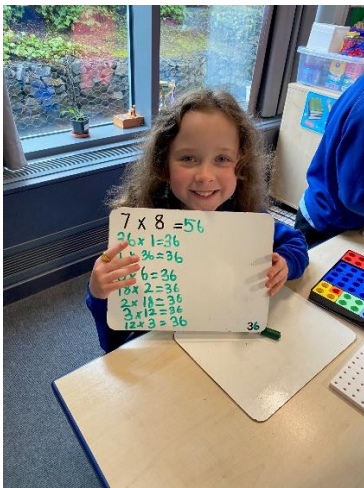
All books contain the same information, but everyone has their own front cover. Here's the list:

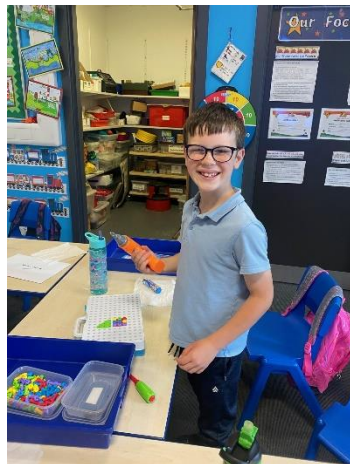
