Robert was busy illustrating ten more. He has used the numicon to illustrate his thinking...




















Brooke, Elsie and Darcey are working on ten more and ten less.








Rowan, George, Zoe and Cooper are busy with three-digit numbers, while David is working with numbers to 20.

Let's see what the photos tell us....




















Going through their paces we have Brooke, Darcey, Robert, George followed by Rowan, Elsie, Zoe, David and Cooper!
