We made these Elmer shapes by cutting and folding. Then we created our own repeat patterns!





















I know someone who loves Elmer! Can you see Paddy's lovely pattern? He's been making a patchwork jigsaw and patterns with our Elmer stories! Well done!






















Our finished results look stunning, don't they?
