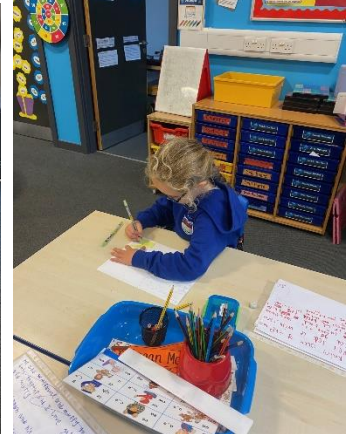
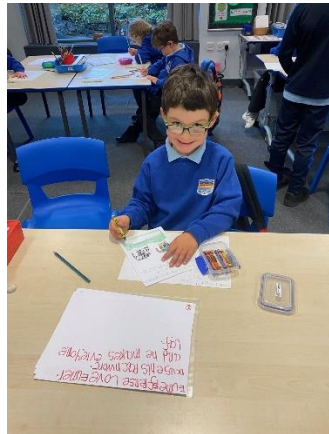


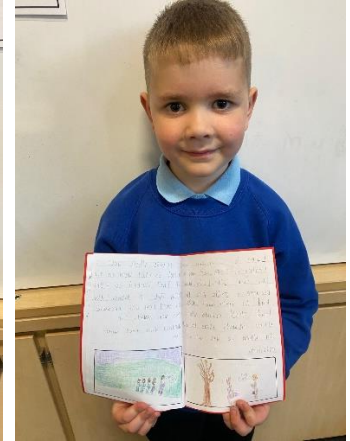
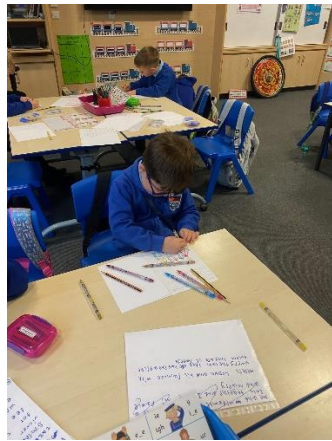
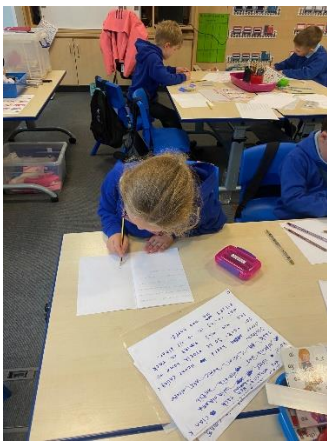
Primary 1-4 Class:

Robert and David have been busy exploring place value within twenty. Cooper, George, Rowan and Zoe had a revision task – matching up the domino cards! What a mixture there were too!

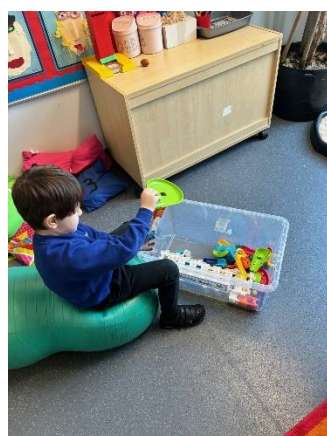

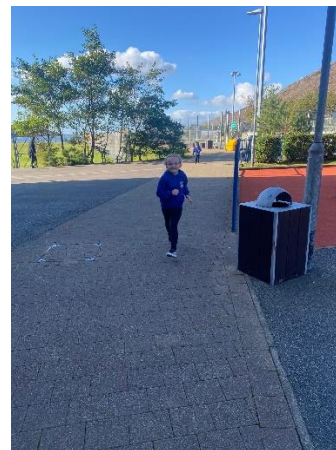
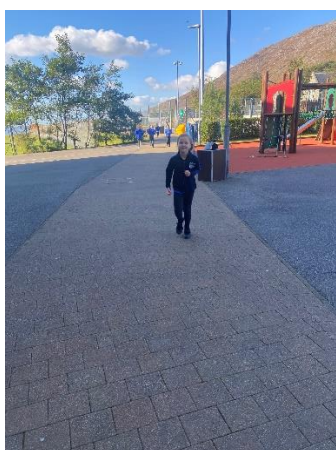
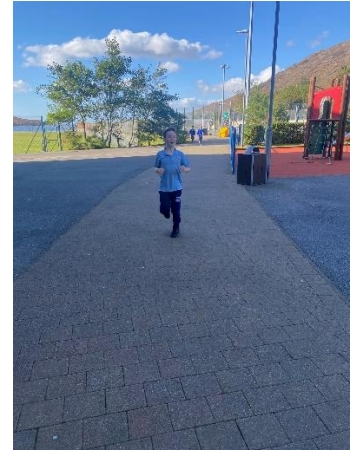


Our Bertie Bassett drawings have made it to the classroom wall before the end of the week!

I'm thinking we might have an Elmer Day...

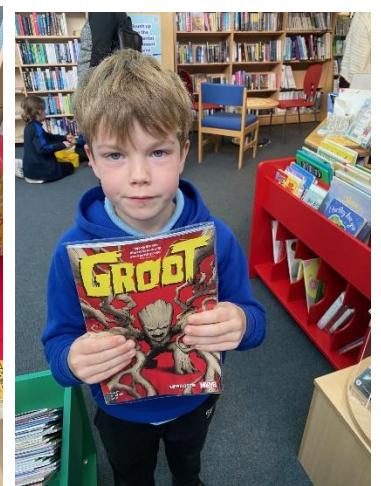
