






Writing:

Our writing tasks are becoming trickier as we are now having to remember ambitious words as well as our new aim of sentence openers.


As is usual with a new aim, our scores have taken a dip, but I'm delighted to report we are now on the up! Well done, everyone – I'm so proud of you!

Well done, George!




