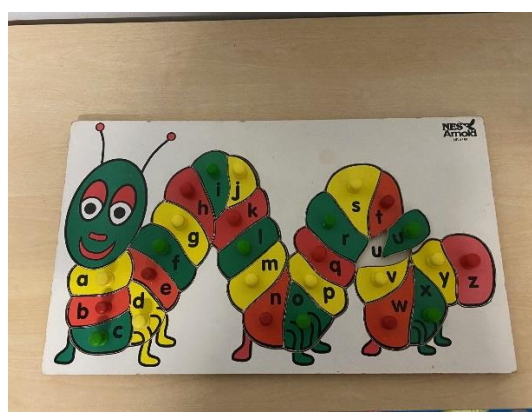
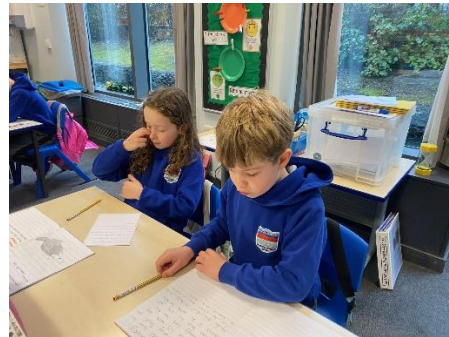

Writing:

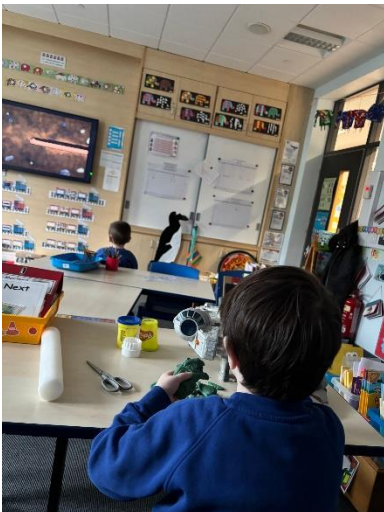

We hope both boys had a lovely day!

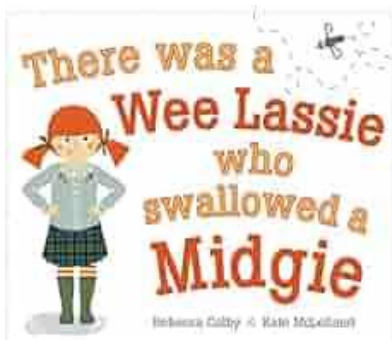
PE:

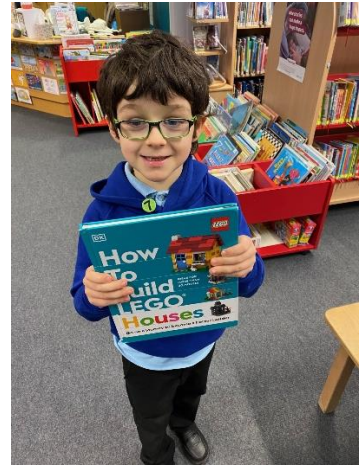
The Library:
