We have been looking at comparing characters in two Julia Donaldson stories – Superworm and Miss Ladybird!







Paddy has been very busy with his mark making too!


The Writing Board:





The book fair is here!




Can you guess who was wearing which costume? It's a bit of a puzzle!



In addition there are some World Book Day pin badges for sale in school next week at a cost of £4. There are a variety of different ones, but I picked out two for sharing!



A spot of Leadership!
