## Maths:



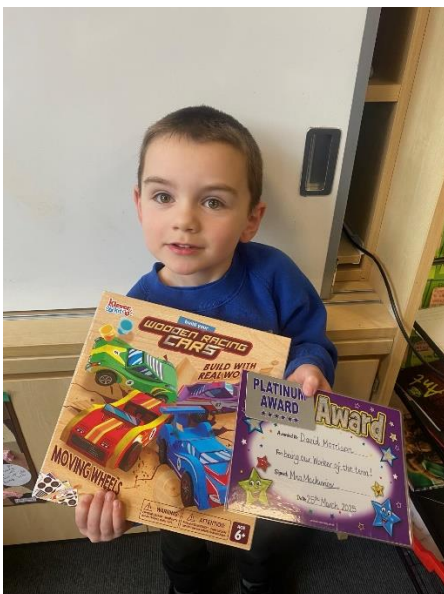
Paddy is able to match number to number. He can match the correct ice cream to its matching cone!
