Interdisciplinary Topic:

Discrete Subjects

Fairyland:

During topic work, children will explore traditional fairytales with a focus on character, plot and setting. Pupils will develop their higher order thinking skills through a range of activities through the context of fairytale. Through drama, children will also explore character movement and body language.

Play Pedagogy

Pupils will be provided with opportunity to learn through play, during maths and literacy activities. Once weekly, pupils will participate in play through a context of learning such as special/significant events in the year e.g. Burns Nights.
