This week we have been considering how animals make themselves camouflaged to protect themselves from predators. What about our worms – can you see them?






We are a bit early in the year, but how exciting to look for worms around school...

...and here we are adding some setting words to our miniboard before 9.00am! It's good to see the children ready to think before our day actually gets going!










All our ideas help us with our writing tasks that we complete a little later in the day!

It's certainly cheered me up this week!




Maths:
