Moving & Handling for individual pupils with complex needs

We have a legal requirement to ensure the safe moving and handling of all our children/young people whose additional support needs mean they require it. Frances Lawson-Tennyson (Team Manager - ASN) has strategic responsibility for Moving and Handling for children with complex needs. Janine Proudlock (Headteacher of Carrongrange High School) oversees the coordination, and delivery of this training. Currently there is a group of 8 trainers. These trainers are from a range of sectors (ELC (Early Learning and Childcare), Primary and Secondary specialist). We request that you identify the number of staff that each school requires to be trained in the moving and handling of individual children with complex additional supports needs, and whether they require full training (initial) or a biannual refresher on an annual basis. You will receive a proforma in 2023 to return to Janine Proudlock for forward planning purposes. If you identify a training need for other staff in moving and handling, the team may well be able to offer this further in the session when the targeted training is complete. We will carry out this return annually in order that we maintain a safe service which meets our legal obligations. ΜΑΥΒΟ

De-escalation and conflict management training roll out continues for specialist provisions and in mainstream schools, for specific cases. The Educational Psychology Service offer de-escalation training, Autism Awareness training (level 1-4) and Nurture training. These should be requested/attended prior to any consideration for MAYBO training. Jenny McNeill leads a Team of 6 FC MAYBO Trainers. In liaison with Head Teachers, identified mainstream schools/TACs may be offered bespoke MAYBO training. Online MAYBO module: available to all specialist provisions including Enhanced Provisions.

SCERTS

The SCERTS Framework provides a robust, evidence based and multi-disciplinary approach to assessment and planning, relevant to individuals with a range of additional support needs, including autism. It includes a focus on Social Communication, Emotional Regulation and Transactional Supports at three developmental stages from pre-verbal to conversational level. SCERTS is lifespan model and could be applied across child and adult services.

NAIT (National Autism Implementation Team) have been championing the SCERTS approach.

FC has 1 severe and complex high school and 6 specialist ASCs (Additional Support Centres) offering intensive intervention for learnings with barriers arising from their autism. FC also has 15 EPs (Enhanced Provision) which have autistic learners receiving intensive support. We also have many autistic learners in our mainstream education settings who may require targeted support. In 2021 FC trained 435 staff. A steering group has been established and some settings have begun to trial this approach. Our main objective is that we have well trained, confident teaching professionals across our specialist provisions delivering SCERTS approaches to autistic learners experiencing barriers to learning.

All our specialist provisions are testing out the approach as appropriate to their local context. SLWGs are developing support packs for the pathway. Frances Lawson-Tennyson is the FC representative for the NAIT SCERTS leadership forum and the chair of the SCERTS Steering Group. We have staff who have joined the Education Scotland SCERTS Practitioner Network. Kenneth Stewart is the Secretary to the Steering Group for this session and is happy to receive any enquiries <u>kenneth.stewart@falkirk.gov.uk</u>, and Sandra Craig will be supporting the implementation of SCERTS this session.


