SfLA (Supply) Recruitment Update

The Central ASN Team in partnership with Secondary School Establishments, will jointly seek to recruit to the post of Supply SFLA, Grade D on a termly basis. Please follow the usual steps;

- 1. ask any current members of Support for Learning Assistants (SFLAs), Grade D, if they would be willing to increase their hours and therefore backfill the deficit in hours.
- 2. contact any known supply SFLAs, Grade D, if they are not in current employment, to ascertain if they would be able to cover the deficit hours.
- 3. contact Educational Supply, Falkirk Council, Education Supply <u>education.supply@falkirk.gov.uk</u> to seek supply cover availability on your behalf.
- 4. If you continue to struggle in finding cover, contact Ann Bateman at ann.bateman@falkirk.gov.uk to inform her of your need. Whilst the termly recruitment is scheduled, she will strive to match candidates in accordance with the highest level of pupil/school need.

ASN ICT

Children with additional support needs are widely supported by the Connected Falkirk Project, although there continues to be a requirement for bespoke programmes and apps. In the first instance you should contact david.wells@falkirk.gov.uk to discuss your young person's requirements. In addition, the ASN Service provide access to the following programmes, where required: Clicker 8, iPad apps, Boardmaker 7, iPad accessibility.

Moving & Handling for individual pupils with complex needs

We have a legal requirement to ensure the safe moving and handling of all our children/young people whose additional support needs mean they require it. Frances Lawson-Tennyson (Team Manager - ASN) has strategic responsibility for Moving and Handling for children with complex needs. Janine Proudlock (Headteacher of Carrongrange High School) oversees the coordination, and delivery of this training. Currently there is a group of 8 trainers. These trainers are from a range of sectors (Early Years, Primary and Secondary specialist). We request that you identify the number of staff that each school requires to be trained in the moving and handling of individual children with complex additional supports needs, and whether they require full training (initial) or a biannual refresher on an annual basis. This is available to book via CPD Manager.

MAYBO

De-escalation and conflict management training roll out continues for specialist provisions and in mainstream schools, for specific cases. The Educational Psychology Service offer de-escalation training, Autism Awareness training (level 1-4) and Nurture training. These should be requested/attended prior to any consideration for MAYBO training. Jenny McNeill leads a Team of 6 FC MAYBO Trainers. In liaison with Head Teachers, identified mainstream schools/TACs may be offered bespoke MAYBO training. Online MAYBO module: available to all specialist provisions including Enhanced Provisions.

EAL

SCERTS

The SCERTS Framework provides a robust, evidence based and multi-disciplinary approach to assessment and planning, relevant to individuals with a range of additional support needs, including autism. It includes a focus on Social Communication, Emotional Regulation and Transactional Supports at three developmental stages from pre-verbal to conversational level, NAIT (National Autism Implementation Team) continue to champion SCERTS approach, and Falkirk is embracing this **neurodivergent affirming model**. Frances Lawson-Tennyson is the FC representative for the NAIT SCERTS leadership forum and the chair of the SCERTS Implementation Team. We are delighted to have Julie Yuill (Educational Psychologist) and Clare Valentine (Speech and Language therapy Lead) join the Team this session. The SCERTS Practitioner Network is established and growing. If you are interested in SCERTS of trialing SCERTS please join the network.

All our specialist settings are on their SCERTS journey, and we are delighted to share their achievements over the coming session. We are all learning together and are here to support one another on this journey.

Please see attached details of the above event taking place on Microsoft Teams on 5th September 2023 - this is a Forth Valley wide online event (hosted by Clackmannanshire & Stirling Council).

Following this session you will:

- have a knowledge of the impact of parental substance use on the well-being of children and young people
- have an understanding of the range of adverse circumstances that affect families where substances are used
- know the importance of early intervention where parental substance use has been identified
- recognise the protective factors which promote resilience
- know how services can engage with families that wish to remain 'hidden'.

Trauma Aware - Before you undertake this training it is useful to offer some clarity around expectations and content.

The training is carried out with the understanding that staff participating may themselves have had adverse childhood experiences or experienced traumatic events - these may be historical or current. On this training you will never be required to disclose any such information but some of the content of the training may resonate with some of your own life experiences. Please consider prior to attending if you feel now is the right time to attend the training for that reason. If you do decide to attend and the content is difficult for you please feel free to leave at any point and find someone you trust and who you can speak to.

Scottish Autism Online Conference – Thursday 5th October 2023

Positive social relationships feature as a key factor in every wellbeing index, yet they are often missing from the way support provision for autistic people is talked about.

This conference will shine a light on the ways in which autistic people's relationships can be recognised and supported — relationships with one another, with family members, with partners, and between supported people and professionals. We will hear from a range of speakers drawing on lived experience, professional practice, and research about the positive ways in which autistic sociality can be supported, while acknowledging the vulnerabilities and difficulties faced by autistic people building relationships in a largely non-autistic world.

Inclusion

NHS have a new Alternative augmentative communication (AAC) area on Turas Learn https://learn.nes.nhs.scot/66889 In this area you will find links to informing and profiling AAC knowledge and skills (IPAACS) which remains a really good way to identify learning needs, and also a series of modules that relate to specific elements within IPAACS. These modules include An Introduction to AAC and, just recently launched, 2 sets of modules with very specific target audiences.

Firstly there are the technology modules. Your role may include preparing or adapting AAC, for example adding vocabulary to the AAC, or you may be responsible for managing the resources and thinking about data privacy implications or charging the equipment. You may be a classroom assistant or personal carer for someone who uses AAC and you may find yourself the go to person for the AAC equipment. This learning has been developed with you in mind!

Secondly there are the assessment modules. You may be a speech and language therapist or student or a teacher or someone working in a voluntary sector organisation with responsibility for assessing and recommending devices and strategies to support.
