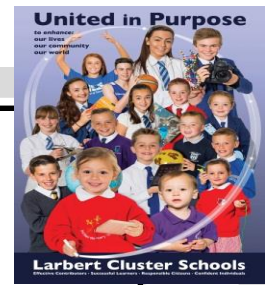

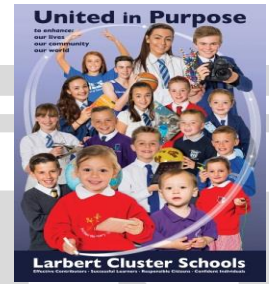

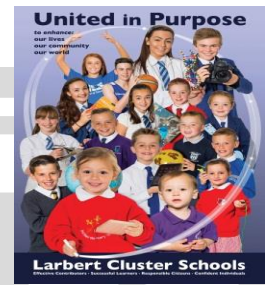

STEM Academy



In STEM Academy, pupils will apply their knowledge and skills gained from the three main STEM subjects to solve real world challenges. For example in S1, pupils are learning about renewable energy and using this to compete in the UK wide BP Challenge along with a visit to the Glasgow Science Centre to explore their Energy for the Future exhibition. In S2/3, pupils will take part in a variety of projects such as the Big Bang Competition and Go4SET. For example the Big Bang Fair Competition allows pupils to focus on finding a solution to real world problems and compete for the title of UK Young Scientist or Engineer of the Year. Shortlisted entries are then invited to the Big Bang Fair at the NEC in Birmingham where pupils showcase their projects to the judges and the general public.

Projected pathway

Pupils will be given the option to select subjects from Science, Technology and continue with Maths. They will also be encouraged to select the Science Baccalaureate and apply for a STEM related Nuffield placement, which gives them university level research experience.

Possible positive destinations

STEM related university courses, vocational courses such as Training and Apprenticeships.



School of Football



School of Football is a Cashback funded programme to develop one's physical, mental & social as well as to improve aspects such as leadership, communication & team work skills. School of Football includes four sessions of football per week (four during curriculum time). This comprises three Health and Wellbeing Periods (PE) and one MESP period. Pupils will build technical, tactical physical and mental skills.

Key skills pupils will build

- Leadership & Responsibility
- Literacy
- MESP

Accreditation/awards pupils will work towards over the three years

- Youth Achievement Award

Projected pathway

After 3 years, pupils can enter a pathway to National 5, Higher or Advanced Higher PE, where football is a core activity. With their additional knowledge and experience of football this could impact positively on Assessment of the one off performance. Not only are they learning the core skills of Football, but they are all gaining vital confidence and developing teamwork and communication skills amongst their peers. Also, leadership is something we find very important and encourage participants to put at the forefront of their learning. The skills developed through their coaching sessions can be directly transferred into Senior WAO's such as Sports Leader.

Possible positive destinations

Coaching ; Sports Development ; HND/HNC Sports & Exercise Science ; Modern Apprenticeships; Basketball Development officer; Sports Development ; HND Sports & Exercise Science .

As this 'School of Football' replace Health and Wellbeing periods in S1, all pupils will be required to attend a minimum of two extra-curricular sessions such as badminton, table tennis or breakfast club to ensure they have the experience of a broader range of activities when progressing into S2.
