Funding

To help support volunteers delivering sport within the community there are a number of funding opportunities available:

Fife Council Community Sports Grants

Grants are available to encourage, support and promote the training and development of sports coaches and officials.

All courses must be recognised by the sportscotland recognised Governing Body (or equivalent body). Applicants must be actively coaching or officiating at a club, community centre or sports centre in Fife in a voluntary capacity.

The grant will only be awarded on proof of attendance and successful completion of the course.

Applicants can receive grants of up to 50% of the total course costs, up to a maximum of $\pounds 200$.

Individual Learning Accounts Scotland (ILA Scotland)

Individual Learning Accounts (ILAs) are for people who are 16 or over and living in Scotland and are for individuals who will benefit most from this support.

You can apply for an ILA if do not have a degree or above, are not undertaking any secondary, further or higher education, training through the Employability Fund * or Modern Apprenticeship, or participating on the Community Jobs Scotland programme.

You must also have an income of $\pounds 22,000$ a year or less, or be on benefits to be eligible to get up to $\pounds 200$ towards the costs of learning or training.

It's a great way to pay for learning new skills and because the money isn't a loan, you don't need to worry about paying it back.

ILA learning providers – including learning centres, local colleges, universities and private training companies – offer a wide range of courses. So whether you need to improve your computer skills or learn something new, we're sure you'll find a course to suit you.

Please note: If your application for ILA funding is successful you will be unable to apply for certain other funding for the duration of your learner year.

This includes Part-Time Fee Grant, Employability Fund and the Modern Apprenticeship scheme. If you would like any further information about Individual Learning Accounts before you apply please contact us on 0800 917 8000.

SportScotland UKCC Funding

SportScotland recognises the importance of new coaches coming into sport and the need for accessible, affordable coaching courses to be available to them.

By filling out the relevant application form eligible applicants can access funding towards the cost of UKCC endorsed qualifications.

Applications must be made at least four weeks prior to the start of the course; retrospective applications will not be accepted.

Adrenaline Auto - Injection

Duration: 1 evening Cost: £12 Age: 16+

The NaRS Adrenaline Auto-Injection Module (NaRS AA) is designed specifically for qualified First Aiders and Pool Rescuers to assist known clients that suffer from a history of anaphylactic reactions and have been prescribed by a GP with their own Adrenaline Auto-injector. This 2 hour course will enable candidates to: recognise an allergic reaction, manage anaphylactic shock, manage anaphylaxis without shock, administer adrenaline by intra-muscular auto-injection, and beware of contra-indications, side-effects and storage implications. Candidates will be required to successfully complete an assessment and demonstrate the ability to carry out various anaphylactic treatments in a safe manner. The course certificate is valid for 24 months. Candidates must hold a current NaRS First Aid or Pool Rescue qualification recognised by the STA.

First Aid at Work

This is a hands on practical First Aid Course which creates a level of competence for first aid skills that meet the requirements for the Health & Safety at Work Act 1981. The course will enable learners to give first aid to a casualty that requires assistance in a variety of emergency situations. The course includes: Resuscitation, shock, bleeding, unconsciousness, contents of first aid boxes, transporting casualties, bones, muscles and joints, minor injuries, poisons, record keeping, hygiene and communicating in an emergency. Attendance is mandatory at all sessions in order to pass the course and the course certificate is valid for 3 years.
