- Works must reflect the themes of COAST, COASTAL LIFE and/or DISTANT SHORES
- Submissions must reach the Scottish Fisheries Museum no later than 5pm on Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> May 2014
- Submissions should be between 6 and 12 minutes in length
- Entries will only be accepted in DVD or memory stick format
- Films should be suitable for viewing by a family audience, the museum reserves the right to exclude films from consideration and screening if the subject matter is deemed to be unsuitable
- Your film must not be in breach of any copyright, including music or sound contained in your entry
- In entering this competition you are giving the Scottish Fisheries Museum permission to show your film at the museum from the date of submission until the 5<sup>th</sup> June 2014
- The entrant is entitled to two complimentary tickets to the Gala Awards Evening on the 17<sup>th</sup> May
- An overall winner, a people's choice and a winner from each category -Under 18s, Young Adult Amateur (18-25), Professional, Adult Amateur (26+) will be selected by a panel of judges including industry professionals, museum staff and film enthusiasts
