

Parental Feedback 2023

As part of our improvement work we asked parents for feedback which is used to create our annual school improvement plan.

How many people responded?

65 parents of our 306 pupils responded.

We will continue to build on these positive areas:

- ✓ 86% said your child likes school or sometimes likes school
- ✓ 86% said your child is treated fairly and with respect or sometimes do
- ✓ 80% of you feel comfortable to approach the school team if there is a query
- ✓ 94% are informed of the work of the parent council
- ✓ 82% think that children have opportunities to learn through digital technology

This is how we plan to make improvements based on the information 65 parents shared with us.

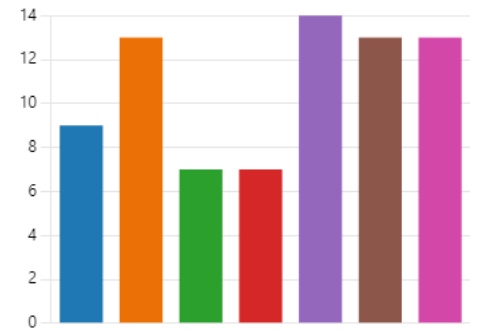
65 parents said:	How we will make improvements now.	How we will make improvements over time.

<p><i>12% (24/65 parents) feel that bullying is dealt with well</i></p>	<p>Our pupils are involved in the creation and leadership of anti—bullying groups. All staff know their collective responsibilities, what bullying is, and who the single point of contact is in reporting bullying concerns.</p> <p>Through lessons in class we teach our children about Equality and the protected characteristics.</p> <p>Work to teach our children how to identify and manage their emotions, through the programme Emotion Works has continued.</p>	<p>We will continue to develop our relationships and regulation policy through restorative approaches, Fife's De-escalation guidance and Scotland's Circle framework.</p> <p>We will have a guide for children, parents and staff for anti-bullying.</p>
<p><i>40% (26/65 parents) think the school takes your views into account</i></p>	<p>We have set up leadership groups for our children to have their say.</p> <p>Opportunity for parental feedback, like these questionnaires and parent council engagement are planned across the year.</p>	
<p><i>71% (46/65 parents) said that your child has opportunities to develop skills for learning, life and work</i></p>	<p>Our school improvement plan has a focus on learners' engagement.</p> <p>Understanding the world of work and why they are learning certain skills and concepts is part of this work.</p>	<p>This will be ongoing as we further rebuild community links.</p>
