2 - School and Nursery Improvement Round-Up

We recently had our annual learning partnership visit - the focus was on high-quality assessments. The visit was very successful.

Key strengths noted were:

In school,

- Staff communicated the purpose of learning well. Almost all children could confidently articulate what they were learning and how to be successful.
- In almost all classes observed, children were able to explain the purpose of their learning. Staff intervened timeously and gave appropriate feedback to support improvements in learning.
- In almost all classes, learners were given opportunities to exercise personalisation and choice to demonstrate their knowledge and understanding and to apply learning in new and unfamiliar contexts.

- In almost all classes, learners were able to talk about the skills they were developing.
- In almost all classes, effective questioning was used to extend learning and deepen understanding.

In the nursery,

- All staff demonstrated positive relationships and quality interactions were observed in nursery
- All staff observed, delivered high-quality questioning during interactions in the nursery playroom
- Almost all children were engaged in productive learning across the nursery playroom and classes
- All staff demonstrated nurturing approaches to support children appropriately in the nursery setting.
- Effective strategies were evident across the nursery to develop speech and communication.

Next steps,

- Vision, values and aims will be refreshed for next session. The consultation process has already begun
- Continue to develop challenge for more able learners in school
- Continue to develop higher-order questioning techniques for staff in school
- Continue to improve learner voice in the leadership of their own learning in nursery and school

Attendance Policy



Fife Council expect every school to monitor and improve attendance. They set a target for us to reach every year. There are a few things you can do to help us to ensure your child is in school as much possible. If your child is unwell or there are exceptional home-related circumstances, please try to call the office or respond to our text message so that we can mark this as an authorised absence. Please ensure you do get in touch otherwise after 3 days, this instigates a "Missing from Education" enquiry. We can only authorise other absences e.g. holidays if you are in the armed services or employed in the emergency services or where you can provide evidence that your employer can only offer leave during term time. We can authorise a period of absence if there are particular family circumstances like bereavement or if your child is competing in a competition. Staff are not expected to provide school work for unauthorised, family holidays. From time to time, we may get in touch with you if your child's attendance is causing concern. Fife Council has provided schools with a standard response letter if your child's attendance has fallen below 85%. We may send this to you or arrange a meeting. The rationale behind this communication is to try to remove any barriers to attendance such as anxiety, parental ill health and financial reasons. Frequent absences cause children distress, gaps in their learning and fractures in their relationships. Please reach out to us too, if you are struggling to ensure that your child attends regularly. We appreciate that each family and child will have their own unique set of circumstances and we want to support on this individualised basis.



3 - Support for Learners

Getting It Right for Every Child

The process of assessing and planning is a continuum, from Universal to Additional to Intensive levels. Universal is the level of planning available for all young people across education provisions. If a child has an additional support/wellbeing need and requires a low level of support which can be offered easily within school resources, then Class Teachers, alongside Learning Support Teachers record this information in a format which indicates some clear assessment information and strategies.

In Fife, we now use the Summary of Support tool to communicate this information to all key staff working with the child/young person, providing a clear indication of what strategies and support is in place.

This type of universal level planning will be shared with the child/young person, their family and staff who support them to ensure that all relevant parties are aware of the identified need(s) and support(s) required to meet it(them).

If your child has a Summary of Support, Staff will be sharing these during Parents' Evening over the coming weeks. Please get in touch if you have any questions regarding this.
