P1-7 Wellbeing Survey October 2021 and May/June 2022

Pupils scored themselves on a 1 to 10 scale for each statement. 1 being strongly disagree, 10 being strongly agree.

The survey was conducted in October and again in May/June 2022. A very similar group of children took part so the results are comparable. In analysing the results, I have considered percentage of pupils giving 8 of 10 or more for each statement and where that gives a decrease or significant increase I have also considered the average rating. There will be a margin or error and so scores which are close should be considered to represent no change. Lucy Jess (Headteacher), June 2022

I can wait until it is my turn	68%	78%	Average rating has also increased from 8.06 to 8.47.
I am good at working with others	74%	53%	In considering the reason for this change, it is worth noting that during the pandemic, opportunities for children to work together were reduced and so children have been more tested in this area as we have moved out of Covid in terms 3 and 4 – they may have left their comfort zone more often in June than they had in October.
People listen to me in school	77%	80%	Average rating has also increased from 8.36 to 8.53. This is a minor gain and, considering margin of error might represent no change.
I would complain if I felt picked on by anyone in school	72%	80%	Average rating has also increased from 8.36 to 8.45.
I stay calm even if I don't get what I want	79%	84%	Average rating has also increased from 8.49 to 8.94.
I work hard in this school	77%	76%	This does not indicate a change.
I like this school	79%	88%	Average rating has also increased from 8.68 to 9.04.
I like being chosen to do things in school	79%	88%	Average rating has decreased from 8.68 to 8.61. In the context of this question we should also consider that there were many more opportunities for which we could choose children in May/June that there had been in October (as we were moving out of pandemic restrictions).
I can stand up for myself in school	87%	80%	Our work this session has encouraged children not to think of retaliation as a way of standing up for themselves but to seek help from a peer or adult. It is pleasing to note elsewhere in this survey that more children report that they would now complain if they were being picked on, that they stay calm when they don't get their own way and that they feel other pupils look out for them. It might be that pupils have interpreted this question to mean they would retaliate.
I will keep trying even if the work is hard	85%	92%	Average rating has also increased from 8.94 to 9.29.
Other pupils look out for me in school	85%	94%	Average rating has also increased from 8.96 to 9.18.

I feel safe in school	91%	88%	While this measure shows a decrease, the average rating per child to this question has increased from 9.04 to 9.29. Given a margin of error, this could be judged to have stayed the same over time.
I follow the school rules	87%	90%	This does not indicate a change.
I am proud of the work I do in school/my work is good	94%	88%	There is also a slight decrease in average rating here (9.23 to 9.04). This is likely within a margin of error and still represents a good level overall but should be monitored next session.
I belong to this school/I feel important to this school	96%	92%	This measure shows a slight decrease as does the average rating per child to this question (9.38 to 9.29). This is likely to be within the margin of error and so could be judged to have stayed the same over time.
People in school can help me if I get upset	94%	92%	This measure shows a very slight decrease as does the average rating per child to this question (9.43 to 9.37).This is likely to be within the margin of error and so could be judged to have stayed the same over time.
I feel good about myself in school	91%	80%	The average rating has also slightly dropped from 9.45 to 9. An average rating of 9 out of 10 and most children rating themselves at 8 out of 10 or above does not in itself represent a concern but it should be monitored.
Teachers tell me what l'm good at	98%	86%	The average rating has also slightly dropped from 9.55 to 9.18. An average rating of 9.18 out of 10 and most children rating themselves at 8 out of 10 or above does not in itself represent a concern but it should be monitored.
I have friends in this school	94%	96%	This does not indicate a change.
Adults look out for me in school/make sure I am feeling ok	100%	96%	While this measure shows a decrease, the average rating per child to this question has increased from 9.62 to 9.65. Given a margin of error, this could be judged to have stayed the same over time.
