



Our School. Our Feedback!

Feedback helps us know how we are doing in our learning and how we can get even better!

Teachers give us feedback by:

- Talking to us about our work and telling us what is good or what could be better. This is called Verbal Feedback.
- Highlighting the parts which meet the success criteria.
- Marking with us on our own or with a group.
- Going over tricky work with all of us.
- Setting an immediate target for the next piece of work.
- Working with us on an immediate target - this might be in the same lesson or in the next one.
- Sharing someone's good example - this gives them feedback that they've done it well and it shows everyone an example to learn from.

We can give each other feedback by:

- Telling each other what we think we've done well.
- Ticking each others' success criteria.
- Traffic Lighting each others' success criteria.



This is called peer-assessment - we can learn from each other!

I can give myself feedback by:

- Re-reading my work, checking it over and correcting mistakes.
- Highlighting against the Success Criteria.
- Ticking and Traffic Lighting the Success Criteria.



This is called self-assessment - if I can learn to give myself feedback, I can learn to make my independent work as good as it can be within everything I have already been taught.
