Are you in primary school? Do you want to use your creative skills to help make your community safer? Then this competition is for you!

For many years, fireworks have been used to celebrate events such as Bonfire Night, Diwali, Chinese New Year and Hogmanay. You might have gone along to a public display in your community or seen fireworks set off in a back garden with your friends and family.

Lots of people enjoy fireworks but they can make others feel scared due to the loud noises and bright flashes. Fireworks and bonfires can also be very upsetting and dangerous for pets, wildlife and farm animals.

This national competition is open to all school pupils in Scotland. Entries can be from individuals, small groups, classes or whole schools.

Key points

- They can be dangerous when not used properly and can cause serious harm to both people and animals.
- Fireworks make loud noises which can be scary.
- Many people use fireworks in their own back gardens and so they can be set off at any time of year.
- Fireworks can cause air pollution.
- They can make some people feel scared or nervous.
- Bonfire Night can be frightening for animals and can lead to them getting hurt when they try to run away.
