Dear Parents,

All schools in Fife are taking part in a five year Transforming Learning project. This year is the first year of the project.

It is important that all parents know and understand the project as all children will benefit from the increased use of technology and development of digital skills as they move up through the school. Initially though, the biggest impact will be on P6&7 children as they will be given a one to one device (an iPad) in the middle of next month. All P6&7s will be given an iPad to support their learning in school. As long as we have parental consent and agreement, they will also be allowed to bring their iPad home to support learning at home. The expectation will be that they bring it back to school each day, fully charged.

The school has already sent the parental agreement information out (in June). Please don't worry if you are not sure if you have signed it or not - over the next week we will email all P6&7 parents about this again.

I have attached a PDF with information about the project - this will be of interest to all parents.

I have also attached a letter inviting P6&7 parents to a meeting in St Andrews where a member of the central Fife Transforming Learning Team will be on hand. Although not being held at our schools, Wormit and Balmerino parents are welcome to attend this if you want as it is a chance to speak to someone who is leading the project across Fife.

We will also be holding one face to face and one Teams session for parents to meet with myself and Mr Rose in the first week of December to discuss what the iPad roll out and Transforming Learning will look like at our school - **ALL** parents, not just P6&7 parents, are welcome to attend those sessions - more details will follow very soon.

Finally - we know a lot of people will have a lot of questions about this. Please use this form to ask your questions, I will then collate them into an FAQs sheet so that all families can benefit from each others' questions:
