



This is an investment in young people to develop their confidence as well as the digital skills they will need throughout their educational journey and beyond.












### **Our Vision**

## Jamf Parent - setting iPad restrictions at home

Using the Jamf Parent app you can:

- allow and restrict apps to choose which apps your child can use
- enable App Lock to set a timer for app restrictions
- create locations to see the approximate location of your child's device
- create a Device Rule to schedule app restrictions

## Showbie - viewing your child's schoolwork at home

By creating a Showbie parent account you can:

- see your child's assignments, feedback, and grades
- receive email or push notifications about new assignments, deadlines, and feedback



## Parental Agreement

Fife Council provides P6-S6 pupils with an iPad to support their learning in and out of school. By your child using this iPad, you, as a parent/carer, agree to the following terms:

#### Responsibility for Parents

- You are responsible for the safe storage and use of the iPad at home
- The iPad should be stored securely when not in use
- If the iPad is lost, stolen, or damaged, report it to the school immediately

- Your child must bring their iPad to school fully charged every day
- No stickers or markings should be placed on the iPad or case
- If your child leaves Fife Council
  Education, the iPad must be returned to their school





## Safeguarding and iPad use at home

The device will support young people's education and creativity – but it also comes with responsibilities around online safety and wellbeing.

#### How you can support at home

- Talk regularly with your child about their online experiences – what they enjoy, what worries them, and who they interact with.
- Set boundaries for screen time and device use, especially around bedtime and social media.
- Encourage responsible behaviourremind them what they post online can have lasting consequences.
- Know where to go for help you can also use CEOP and Fearless to learn more about online risks and how to respond.
