Outdoor Learning: Natural Connections Active Fife - leisure hub	To enhance learning and understanding we plan opportunities to enhance and extend learning outdoors. We will also be exploring the Natural Connections outdoor learning award.

Interdisciplinary Learning (IDL)

Our class IDL topic this term is **My Life in Fife**.

At my own level I can:

- create a map of my local area.
- locate local landmarks/places of interest on a map of Fife.
- talk about the different types of housing available.
- investigate the different types of food produced in Fife.
- explore ways in which my school can look after our local environment.

Listening & talking	 We will be focussing on the following listening and talking targets listen to our class stories and answer a range of comprehension questions. listen to and respond appropriately to others, for example, by nodding or agreeing or asking and answering questions. 	
French (L2)	We will be learning to Iocate France on a map of the world. name some of the landmarks. recap French greetings.	
Number, money & measure	 We will be focussing on the following number, money and measure targets explore the link between a digit, its place and its value. addition and subtraction strategies. explore or explain the difference between length, height, mass and capacity. Investigate, with hands on activities, standard units of measure, e.g. cm, m, ml, L, g, kg. 	
Shape, position & movement	This is not a core focus this term although incidental learning will take place through our mapping of the local area exercise during our IDL lessons where pupils will use words associated with direction and turning.	
Information handling	We will be focussing on the following information handling targets At my level I can interpret pictograms produced by others. interpret pictograms produced by others where each picture represents more than one unit. make predictions in light of results of my own data collection.

Science	We will be focussing on the following science targets Forces At my own level I can: use the vocabulary associated with forces i.e., push, pull, squash, stretch, twist. predict and investigate how a force can make an object change shape, speed or direction. learn about balanced forces and how this impacts movement. explore the forces exerted by magnets on other magnets and magnetic material.

Technologies	We will be focussing on the following technologies targets Digital literacy At my own level I can: • begin to independently use class computers and the various platforms we use to extend learning (Sumdog/Teach Your Monster/Topmarks). • show how to look after our IT equipment.
Religious & Moral Education	We will be focussing on the following RME targets At my own level I can • develop respect for others and an understanding of their beliefs and values. • explore Bible stories and describe some Christian beliefs. • express my own beliefs and values.

Supporting learning at home:

Homework will be issued on a Tuesday and be returned the following Monday.

Your child will bring home a Home Learning Grid, where they can select an activity to complete at home. They will also have a reading book. We ask that your child's reading book comes with them to school **every** day, as they will be taking part in guided reading activities in school as well as at home.
