

Interdisciplinary Learning (IDL)

Our class IDL topic this term is Ancient Egyptians

This term, we will learn about Ancient Egypt, exploring its people, places, and inventions. We will try Egyptian-inspired art, hands-on activities, and use digital tools to find out more. We will also take part in drama, movement, and creative writing, while practicing some maths linked to the topic.

Curriculum Areas and Subjects:		
Reading	 In class our novel this term will be - We will be focussing on the following reading targets Notice punctuation and text features like full stops, question marks, exclamation marks, bold text, and block capitals. Use punctuation and text features to help me understand and read with expression. Explore non-fiction texts and use what I have read to help me discuss aspects of our topic. 	
Writing	 We will be focussing on the following writing targets Write an effective description: Use a clear and interesting title that tells the reader what you are describing. Use words to describe size, shape, number, texture, and colour. Include fun language like similes, metaphors, or sounds (onomatopoeia). Use words to show position and include topic-specific vocabulary. 	
Listening & talking	We will be focussing on the following listening and talking targets • Actively listen, with respect, in a range of different situations • Stay focused and give my full attention to the speaker, with some support if needed	
French (L2)	We will be learning I can use French greetings with confidence and pronounced correctly. I can continuing to practise saying and recognising the numbers 0-20 in French.	
Number, money & measure	 We will be focussing on the following number, money and measure targets Round whole numbers to the nearest 10, 100 or 1000 Begin to understand and use numbers to 1000, 10000 and beyond Explain the link between a digit, it's place and its value in numbers up to 1000 and beyond Continue patterns with numbers. 	
Shape, position & movement	 We will be focussing on the following shape, position and movement targets Select an object given a description of its features. Understand that both 2D shapes and 3D objects can be created by deconstructing and reconstructing other shapes. 	

	 Use language such as side, face, edge, corner, surface, curved, base and angle when describing shapes. I can use nets to build a 3D pyramid shape. I can try using the Egyptian number system to solve problems.
Information handling	We will be focussing on the following information handling targets Not covered this term

Health and Wellbeing	 We will be focussing on the following health and wellbeing targets: I can explain what kindness looks like, sounds like and feels like. I can show kindness to others. I am familiar with the different coloured cogs in emotion works and know what they mean.
Physical Education:	 We will be focussing on the following PE targets: Follow the rules of simple games and take turns work with others, sharing ideas and helping my team Our gym days this term are: Monday and Thursday Please come to school on your outdoor PE day (Thursday), wearing plain gym kit – black or grey tracksuit bottoms/leggings or shorts, a plain white t-shirt and school jumper. No cropped tops/vests or football tops/strips.
Expressive Arts – Art, Drama, Dance and Music	 We will be focussing on the following expressive arts targets Art: Use ideas from real Egyptian artefacts to inspire my own artwork. Design and draw my own Egyptian headdress, using patterns and colours from real artefacts. Drama: Use mime or role-play to act out the role of an Egyptian (pharaoh, noble, farmer, slave) Through drama activities, I can listen carefully, follow instructions, and stay focused

Science	We will be focussing on the following science targets Not covered this term
Social Studies	 We will be focussing on the following Social Studies this targets Explain how life in Ancient Egypt was different for pharaohs, nobles, farmers, and slaves. Name some famous pharaohs (like Tutankhamun and Cleopatra) and say why they were important.
Technologies	 We will be focussing on the following technologies targets Log in to GLOW by using my own username and password Use OneDrive to save, open, and find my own work Create a PowerPoint presentation about Ancient Egypt. I will learn the skills to: ⇒ Add a new slide ⇒ Write a title ⇒ Insert pictures ⇒ Save my work on OneDrive
Religious & Moral Education	 We will be focussing on the following RME targets Talk about different Egyptian gods and say what they were believed to do. Use what I know about Egyptian gods to answer questions or share ideas in class. Show respect for other people's beliefs when learning about Egyptian gods.

Supporting learning at home:

Homework will be issued on a Tuesday and be returned the following Monday.

Your child will bring home a Home Learning Grid, where they can select an activity to complete at home. They will also have a reading book. We ask that your child's reading book comes with them to school **every** day, as they will be taking part in guided reading activities in school as well as at home.

- Children can practise their number bonds and times tables by playing <u>Hit the Button Quick fire maths</u> practise for 6-11 year olds
