As a whole school we will be planning and celebrating our **Christmas Show** to share with parents on the afternoon of Thursday the 18<sup>th</sup> of December. The performance gives everyone an opportunity to perform in front of an audience, displaying acting, singing, dancing and production skills.

# Interdisciplinary Learning (IDL)

Our class IDL topic this term is a comparative study of Scotland and Japan.

- I will plot the main locations and geographical features on a map of Scotland and Japan.
- I will learn about and compare the main geographical features of Scotland and Japan.
- I will investigate traditional dishes/food of Scotland and Japan.
- I will explore the languages and history of both geographical areas.

Reading	In class our novel this term will be 'Slugboy saves the World', a Scottish superhero adventure.  I can answer inferential questions about a text. I can answer evaluative questions about a text. I can ask questions to help make sense of a text. I can identify the main ideas of a text and spoken text and use this to summarise what I have read.

We ask that your child's reading book comes with them to school **every** day, as they will be taking part in guided reading activities in school as well as at home.

- Encourage reading, watching and listening to a range of genres. Consider getting your child a library card and visiting our local libraries in Newport, St Andrews or Cupar.
