
## **Balmullo PS Learning Overview**

Traditionally in Term 2 each class plans and makes items to sell at our **Christmas Market** as part of an enterprise topic. As a whole school we will be planning and celebrating our **Christmas Show** to share with parents on the afternoon of Thursday the 18<sup>th</sup> of December. The performance gives everyone an opportunity to perform in front of an audience, displaying acting, singing, dancing and production skills.

# Interdisciplinary Learning (IDL)

Our class IDL topic this term is 'Journey of a River.'

At our own level we will learn to -

- Understand what rivers are, name and describe key parts of a river and the role they play in shaping environments and supporting ecosystems.
- Understand the erosion and deposition process.
- Understand how people live and work near rivers and the human impact of pollution and flooding.
- Find major rivers of the world on a map and make comparisons with rivers in our local area.
- Understand a rivers role in the water cycle.

Curriculum Areas and Subjects:		
Reading	In class our novel this term will be Journey to the River Sea by Eva Ibbotson. We will be focussing on the following reading targets:  • I can summarise a text by using the who, what, when, where and why method, naming key characters and events.  • I can recognise a wider range of high frequency words and vocabulary to support my reading.  • I can read aloud with increasing expression and confidence.  • I can make predictions about what might happen next.	
Writing	We will be focussing on the following writing targets:  I can create a procedural text that is well structured and includes all key features.  I can use imperative verbs and sequencing words correctly in my writing.  I can plan my procedural writing thinking about purpose and audience.  I can assess and edit my own writing.	
Listening & talking	<ul> <li>We will be focussing on the following listening and talking targets:</li> <li>I can participate in group discussions, make meaningful contributions, and extend the ideas shared by others.</li> <li>I can listen to others, respect their ideas, and know when it's my turn to speak.</li> <li>I can show my understanding of what I listen to or watch by responding to different types of questioning and asking questions of my own.</li> </ul>	
French (L2)	<ul> <li>We will be learning:</li> <li>Revision of French greetings, numbers to 30, days of week and months of the year.</li> <li>French words for objects in the classroom and at home.</li> <li>To describe key aspects of French culture including famous landmarks, food and daily life and compare with my own.</li> </ul>	

	Christmas vocabulary and songs in French.
Number, money & measure	<ul> <li>We will be focussing on the following number, money and measure targets:</li> <li>I can identify the value of a digit in each number.</li> <li>I can read, write and say numbers to 100 000 and beyond.</li> <li>I can use my knowledge of equivalent fractions and division to simplify fractions.</li> <li>I understand mixed numbers and improper fractions.</li> <li>I can multiply and divide whole numbers and decimal fractions</li> </ul>
Shape, position & movement	<ul> <li>We will be focussing on the following shape, position and movement targets</li> <li>I can draw prisms, cylinders, cubes, cuboids, and cones recognisably using various mathematical tools.</li> <li>I can use the term circumference, diameter and radius to accurately describe parts of a circle.</li> <li>I can discuss the similarities and differences between regular and irregular polygons.</li> </ul>
Information handling	We will be focussing on the following information handling targets.  Not covered this term.

Expressive Arts – Art, Drama, Dance and Music	We will be focussing on the following expressive arts targets  Art: I can build 3D model of a river system.  I can re create textures of water.  I can use paint to create a river scene.  Drama:  I can use my voice clearly and project to an audience who can hear me.  I can work cooperatively with others to rehearse a performance showing timing and awareness of audience.  Music: I can perform with an instrument voice to an audience.  I understand tone, rhythm, timbre and dynamics and can demonstrate this when performing.
Science	We will be focussing on the following science targets  See IDL targets

Technologies	<ul> <li>We will be focussing on the following technologies targets:</li> <li>I can use technology to research key facts about rivers and decide which information is reliable.</li> <li>I can describe how technology affects rivers and the environment and suggest ways to make these effects more sustainable.</li> <li>I can use technology to design and create a model of a river.</li> </ul>
Religious & Moral Education	We will be focussing on the following RME targets  I can show understanding of the beliefs of

World Religions and explore the similarities and differences between these and my developing beliefs.

 I can describe and reflect upon practices and traditions of World religions.

### Supporting learning at home:

Homework will be issued on a Tuesday and be returned the following Monday.

Your child will bring home a Home Learning Grid, where they can select an activity to complete at home. They will also have a reading book. We ask that your child's reading book comes with them to school **every** day, as they will be taking part in guided reading activities in school as well as at home.

- Children can practise their number bonds and times tables by playing <u>Hit the Button Quick fire maths</u> practise for 6-11 year olds
- Encourage reading, watching and listening to a range of genres. Consider getting your child a library card and visiting our local libraries in Newport, St Andrews or Cupar.
