How and When to Apply for Courses

Applications open in January 2018 and from then, you can apply for courses at any time – in fact, with courses being so popular, we recommend that you apply as early as possible.

Things to remember:

- You don't have to wait until you receive your exam results to apply; conditional offers for places can be given subject to you passing your exams
- You can apply for more than one course, but you can only accept one offer and only one application will be progressed at any one time
- You don't have to complete your application form all in one sitting, you can return to it at a later date using your login details so make sure you save these
- When you apply online, we will communicate with you via email. Remember to check your junk email folder for information
- Visit the How to Apply section on our website for further information

Once you've found the course that's right for you, follow the 'apply online' link within the relevant course entry to submit your application online.

You will be asked to provide your name, date of birth and a valid email address, and to create a password. It is important that you enter these details accurately and remember them as you will need this information to access the system again.

Studying for a career in Performing Arts

"I applied for HND: Acting and Performance at college straight from fifth year at school. The application process was all online and was really straight forward. After I had submitted my application, I was invited for an interview and an audition at the College. I found the whole experience really easy, which was a relief!

"There was a more informal workshop before the audition — and I was made to feel totally at ease throughout it all. There was even the option of auditioning for only the lecturer instead of in front of the group and I was offered a conditional place there and then.

"The interview was actually a really good experience and it was helpful to meet the other students and the lecturers before starting the course.

"I loved my course – I don't think I could've picked anything better for me as a person. Even the bits that weren't as much 'fun' were fine as I enjoyed just being there.

"I'm now at the University of Sunderland studying BA (Hons) Drama and hopefully I'll go on to do a Masters degree."

What happens after I've applied?

We are committed to ensuring our admissions process is fair, transparent and consistent for all of our potential students.

We understand that it can be frustrating waiting on news of your application. But don't panic if you don't hear back straight away. The diagram to the right provides a summary of the process your application will go through from submission date to outcome.

And don't forget, you can also track your application online by logging in using the login details you created when you applied.

Any correspondence, including offers or invitations to interviews, etc. will be sent out to you by email so it is vital that you let us know if you change your email address.

You may be required to attend an interview. Certain courses, for example art and design or performing arts, will require a portfolio of work or participation in an audition. Other courses may require an application for a PVG check. We will notify you of what is required when we send you an offer.

Qualifications Explained

The Scottish Credit and Qualifications Framework (SCQF) is a way of comparing the wide range of different Scottish qualifications. It covers achievements from school, college and university as well as many work-based qualifications.

Every Scottish university and college uses SCQF levels to describe their courses. The level of a qualification indicates its level of difficulty.

The table to the right will give you a quick and easy to understand guide to the different SCQF levels and where each individual qualification fits in.

Certificate Courses

Certificate courses are the perfect stepping stone for those with no or few formal qualifications who want to progress to higher levels of study. Certificate courses do not lead to a nationally recognised group award but do contain nationally recognised subject/unit qualifications. They are a cluster of units, mainly at SCQF Level 4, that will give you an appropriate set of skills and knowledge to support you on to the next level of your education or chosen career path.

Intermediate Certificate Courses

Intermediate Certificate courses do not lead to a nationally recognised group award but do contain nationally recognised subject/unit qualifications. They are a cluster of units, mainly at SCQF Level 5, that will give you an appropriate set of skills and knowledge to support you on to the next level of your education **Degrees** or chosen career path.

Advanced Certificate Courses

Advanced Certificate courses do not lead to a nationally recognised group award but do contain nationally recognised subject/unit qualifications. They are a cluster of units, mainly at SCQF Level 6, that will give you an appropriate set of skills and knowledge to support you on to the next level of your education or chosen career path.

National Certificate and City & Guilds Courses

These courses are designed for school leavers and mature students. typically with a duration of one year. They contain a nationally recognised group award qualification and can be used as a stepping stone to employment or on to further study at a higher level.

Higher National Certificate (HNC)

HNCs are normally offered through the equivalent of one year full-time study and are generally recognised as the equivalent of your first vear of study at university. Upon successful completion of an HNC. you have the option of progressing to an HND, degree or employment.

Higher National Diploma (HND)

An HND is two years of study if done as a full-time course. If you're progressing through from HNC level, you can go straight into the second and final year of the HND. This means that you will only need a year to complete your qualification. HNDs are generally recognised as your second year of university study and give you the option of progressing through to a degree (often entering year 3 of the degree course) or employment.

There are many routes to studying a degree with Fife College. Working alongside partner universities, we offer a great range of degrees right on your doorstep, as well as articulation routes to a wide range of university courses with the benefit of studying the first two years locally.

- SWAP Scottish Wider Access Programme.
 - These courses are specifically designed for those who have been out of formal education for some time and want to return and progress to Higher Education
- SVQ Scottish Vocational
- NVQ National **Vocational Qualification**
- VRQ Vocationally Recognised Qualification
- School-College Partnership Course These courses are available at Fife High Schools. Speak to your school's Guidance team or SDS Advisor.



Studied for a career in Graphic Design

"Before college I had always been interested in Art and Design, it was my favourite subject at school.

"I was encouraged by my careers advisor at Inverkeithing High School to follow the path from Advanced Certificate: Graphic and Digital Design to BA Visual Communications and Digital Publishing at Fife College. He told me it was good alternative to university.

"I really enjoyed my time at Fife College; I was there for four vears in total and studied at both St Brycedale and Stenton Campuses. I really enjoyed the mix of tutors I had throughout my time at the College; they all came from industry backgrounds so I was sure that I was receiving an excellent standard of education.

"As well as design, the courses taught me great communication skills such as pitching ideas or presenting final outcomes to the class. In the degree course, our year was the first year to run the module which requires students to set up a working design agency, pitching for client work, producing high quality design, sourcing print etc. This was valuable and helped me feel more confident going into the working world of design.

"When I first graduated I took on some freelance work, working with local companies in Fife, such as the Aberdour Festival, and friends and family. In 2013 I accepted my first job as an in-house graphic designer for Heriot-Watt University Student Union where I have continued to grow in mv career."

At Fife College, our courses are designed to help you develop Core and Essential Skills so that you are ready for employment when you complete your studies.

These skills are developed in all of our courses. The Core Skills valued by employers are:

- Communication
- Numeracy
- Information and communication technology
- Working with others
- Problem solving

Core Skills are different to Essential Skills. Essential Skills include all of the Core Skills, plus:

- personal and learning **skills** including literacy skills that enable you to become an effective lifelong learner
- employability skills including career management skills that prepare you for employment rather than for a specific occupation
- vocational skills that are specific to a particular occupation, industry or sector

These Essential Skills help to create T-shaped, work-ready people.

Studying for a career in Interior Design

"I have moved home several times and love decorating. When I was younger my parents took us to different castles at the weekends and I just loved all the different architecture and interiors.

"I was doing care work previously but the lady I cared for sadly passed away; she always encouraged me to be doing more so after she died, I thought about what my passions were and decided to re-train at something I loved. Originally I had thought about painting and decorating but when I looked at the courses available online I saw HNC: 3D Interior Design and thought that would be perfect.

"I really enjoyed the course. As a mature student it was difficult at times to balance the workload with family time but I really liked the variety of projects that we covered. To be honest, I thought before starting that it would be mainly residential interiors we would be doing, so I really liked that there were other elements that pushed me out of my comfort zone.

"I learned so much over the two years, from using design software to practical theory and researching efficiently. It's definitely prepared me for taking the next step.

"After completing the HNC I did a placement at Brand-Rex in Glenrothes and redesigned all the staff canteens. I am now studying for my BA (Hons) Interior Design degree at Heriot-Watt University. I would never have even thought about applying to university if it hadn't been encouraged by my tutors at Fife College.

"I'm now working to finish my degree with the highest pass I can achieve and either find a job with an established interior/architecture firm or start my own interior design business."



Building Services

National Certificate: Electrical Engineering (Electrical Installation)

SCQF Level 5

Stenton Campus, Glenrothes

This course is part of an introduction to electrical installation and is delivered over one year. It gives you the opportunity to partake in a work placement activity over three 3-week periods with an electrical installation company.

Entry Requirements

Evidence of good attendance and timekeeping from school, college or the workplace is necessary, as is one of the following:

- Two National 4s or equivalent (see our Qualifications Explained section for details) and two National 5s at Level C or above or equivalent including Maths and English
- Certificate: Construction Futures
- Successful completion of an engineering course at SCQF
- Relevant industry experience and/or other qualifications will be considered on an individual basis and you will be required to pass a pre-entry test

In addition, internal applicants will also require a positive Internal Learner Reference (ILR).

National Progression Award: Plumbing and Electrical Building Services

SCQF Level 5

Stenton Campus, Glenrothes

This course is aimed at those who have an interest in following a career in plumbing, electrical installation or building services in general. You will study a series of units covering basic plumbing and electrical skills and consider energy and the environment and its link to building services

Entry Requirements

Evidence of good attendance and timekeeping from school, college or the workplace is necessary, as is one of the following:

- Four National 4s or equivalent (see our Qualifications Explained section for details) including Maths and English
- Successful completion of the School-College Partnership course Skills for Work: Construction Craft (Fife schools only) plus National 4s in English and Maths
- Certificate: Construction Futures
- Successful completion of an engineering course at SCQF

In addition, internal applicants will also require a positive Internal Learner Reference (ILR).

National Certificate: Building Services Engineering

SCQF level 6

Stenton Campus, Glenrothes

This course is aimed at providing you with knowledge in the basic principles of building services engineering. It focuses on the design, installation, maintenance, and management of building services systems i.e. heating, ventilating and air conditioning, electrical, and plumbing.

Entry Requirements

- National 5 Maths at Level C or equivalent (see our Qualifications Explained section for details), or above
- Candidates with an equivalent qualification in building services engineering will also be considered

In addition, internal applicants will also require a positive Internal Learner Reference (ILR).

SVO: Domestic Natural Gas Installation and Maintenance

SCQF Level 6

Halbeath Campus. Dunfermline

This intensive course is designed for those seeking to pursue a new career within the gas industry. Upon successful completion, you will receive an SVQ Diploma in Domestic Natural Gas and will be qualified to work as a gas engineer on central heating and hot water systems.

Entry Requirements

You should have job-related experience in mechanical services, mechanical engineering or electrical and will be selected through college tests and an interview process.

In addition, internal applicants will also require a positive Internal Learner Reference (ILR).

Built Environment Technician and Interior Design

National Certificate: Built Environment

SCOF Level 6

Stenton Campus, Glenrothes

This course will develop knowledge, understanding and skills relevant to careers within the built environment industry. It is ideal for those who desire to work in the industry. This is an ideal course if you want to progress on to technician roles in quantity surveying, architectural technology or construction management.

Entry Requirements

One of the following:

- Three National 4s or equalivent and two National 5s at Level C or above or equivalent (see our Qualifications Explained section for details) which must include Maths
- A course at SCQF Level 5 in either construction or engineering and SCQF Level 5 Maths: Craft 1 (F3HV11) or equivalent
- Relevant industry experience and/or other qualifications will be considered on an individual basis

In addition, internal applicants will also require a positive Internal Learner Reference (ILR).

HNC: 3D Interior Design

SCOF Level 7

Stenton Campus, Glenrothes

This course specialises in interior design and is about designing spaces and places for people, creating interior schemes and solving problems to improve the world around us. It enables you to develop the creative, analytical and technical skills for jobs in the interior design profession.

Entry Requirements

One of the following:

- National Certificate: Architecture with Interior Design SCQF Level 6
- Another relevant course at SCQF Level 6
- Higher Art and Design at Level C or above plus National 5 English at Level C or above or equivalent (see our Qualifications Explained section for details)
- Higher Graphic Communication at Level C or above plus National 5 English at Level C or above or equivalent (see our Qualifications Explained section for details)
- An appropriate portfolio of artwork

In addition, internal applicants will also require a positive Internal Learner Reference (ILR).

HNC: Architectural Technology (Part-Time Only)

SCOF Level 7

Stenton Campus, Glenrothes

This is a varied course that provides a valuable insight into the diverse technical aspects which are fundamental to the architectural professions.

Entry Requirements

One of the following:

- One Higher at Level C or above in a relevant subject plus three National 5s at Level C or above or equivalent (see our Qualifications Explained section for details) which must include Maths
- National Certificate: Built Environment SCQF Level 6 (with additional maths for construction technician unit)
- National Certificate: Civil Engineering SCQF Level 6 (with additional maths for construction technician unit)
- Level 2 Design Engineer Construct
- Foundation Apprenticeship: Civil Engineering
- Another relevant course at SCQF Level 6
- Relevant industry experience and/or other qualifications will be considered on an individual basis

In addition, internal applicants will also require a positive Internal Learner Reference (ILR).

HNC: Construction Management (Part-Time Evenings Only)

SCOF Level 7

Halbeath Campus. Dunfermline Stenton Campus, Glenrothes

This nationally recognised course has been designed to provide all the knowledge and understanding necessary for a career in construction management.

Entry Requirements

One of the following:

- One Higher at Level C or above plus three National 5s at Level C or above or equivalent (see our Qualifications Explained section for details) which must include Maths
- National Certificate: Built Environment SCQF Level 6
- National Certificate: Civil Engineering SCQF Level 6
- Another relevant course at SCQF Level 6
- Successful completion of the School-College Partnership course Pre-MA/Pathway to HE in Built Environment (Fife
- Relevant industry experience and/or other qualifications will be considered on an individual basis

In addition, internal applicants will also require a positive Internal Learner Reference (ILR).

HNC: Civil Engineering

SCOF Level 7

Stenton Campus, Glenrothes

This course is designed to equip you with knowledge. understanding and skills to allow you to gain employment in the construction, construction engineering, structural and civil engineering fields, or to progress to a Higher Education or professional body qualification.

Entry Requirements

One of the following:

- One Higher at Level C or above plus three National 5s at Level C or above or equivalent (see our Qualifications Explained section for details) which must include Maths
- National Certificate: Built Environment SCQF Level 6 (with additional maths for construction technician unit)
- National Certificate: Civil Engineering SCQF Level 6 (with additional maths for construction technician unit)
- Foundation Apprenticeship: Civil Engineering
- Another relevant course at SCQF Level 6
- Relevant industry experience and/or other qualifications will be considered on an individual basis

In addition, internal applicants will also require a positive Internal Learner Reference (ILR).

HNC: Quantity Surveying (Part-Time Only) SCOF Level 7

Stenton Campus, Glenrothes

This course has been designed to provide you with the knowledge and understanding necessary to start a career in quantity surveying. It is also ideal for those already working in the sector who are looking to progress in their career.

Entry Requirements

One of the following:







"The learning is completely different to what I was used to at school; it's open, you can express yourself, and everyone is there for each other.


"From a young age, I experienced a lot of loss and I always knew I wanted to make a difference in other people's lives, especially those who had maybe made bad choices.

"I really enjoyed studying history and modern studies at high school. I was always interested in gaining a deeper understanding of the inner workings of the social world and sought to continue these interests in further education.





This course provides an introduction to working with children and develops the skills, values and attributes required to study within the field of childcare. You will learn about the importance of play, child development, children's rights and protection and how to support children with additional support needs.

It was great to have these insights, skills and knowledge before taking the step up to HND. It was also a really fun course and we got to work backstage at catwalk shows.

"My favourite part of the HND course has been the commercial design elements, where we get to design and sketch garments. I've really enjoyed finding source books and something that inspires me and then going on to sketch my own designs before turning the designs into real, finished garments. I love being so creative.

"After completing my HND, I'm planning to move to Manchester to work in the fashion industry there. I've always wanted to get out there and experience new cities and start new chapters in my life, and I think that this has made me work that bit harder over the last three years studying fashion.

"The HND course has certainly prepared me for moving into the workplace. Especially in the last three months where we've all been applying for jobs or getting ready for university, we've been pulling together all the work we've done on the HND course and building our portfolios."

"I had an interest in film and theatre production from a very young age and decided to take up performing arts as an opportunity to put my creative visions into action.

"I decided to study at Fife College as I was told that they had one of the best drama facilities. It was then that my lecturer suggested that I concentrate on my creative writing as she believed that it was one of my strengths and saw great potential in me.

"I enjoyed HND: Acting and Performance very much especially the investigative and creative modules which had given me the tools to move my dream forward. I think that this course has given me a great deal of knowledge on how to write, direct, produce and even act in my own plays.

"After leaving the course, I moved on to screenwriting where I became a member of Scottish screenwriters. In 2015, I decided to write a play called 'Splitting' which was premiered at the prestigious Edinburgh Fringe festival. It was then that I realised that writing had always been my calling and I couldn't have asked for a better lecturer, she was definitely right.

"My ambition is to produce my first full feature film at the end of this year and hopefully become part of the BBC writers' room."

Community Skills

SCOF Level 2 Halbeath Campus, Dunfermline Stenton Campus, Glenrothes

Studying for a career in Childcare

"I think that because I came straight from school. and I was used to doing schoolwork and studying for my Highers, I've found the workload of the course more manageable. The study is a lot more independent than at school, though, which hit me a bit; I maybe wasn't prepared for that.

"I didn't think the graded unit would be enjoyable but it really was. It was probably my favourite part of the course because I got to really focus in on one topic for it, rather than the range of topics needed for the essays throughout the course.

"I think that it's good that two days a week on the course are spent on placement. It provides a fantastic balance between theory and practice. I don't think I'd have got as much from it if I was just doing theory without having the opportunity to put it into practice.

"After completing HNC: Childhood Practice, I'm going to Aberdeen for university to study primary teaching. I think coming to college before university was a really good idea. In hindsight, I don't think I'd have been ready for uni if I'd gone this year. Socially I would have been fine, but study-wise I would have struggled without the experience of this year at college. Even from the first essays I did this year to now, there is a big difference in my writing, so I'm really glad I came to college first as a stepping stone to the degree.'

Progressing to University



Articulation Routes

An articulation route is a pathway between an HNC or an HND and a degree course, agreed between the College and a university. These routes are reviewed annually. This means that the university and the College have worked in partnership to make sure the content of your HN course matches the content of the first year (or first two years) of your chosen degree in order to ensure a smooth transition to university.

These articulation routes mean that you can study an HNC or HND with Fife College then progress directly on to a specified degree course at a specified university; usually with entry into second or third year. This ensures that you can continue to move forward with your studies without repeating material and finish your Honours degree in four years, just as you would have if you'd gone straight to university.

Articulation also offers you the more affordable option of studying the first two years locally.

By successfully completing years one and two at college, you will achieve an HNC and HND respectively. This allows for a level of flexibility; if a career opportunity should arise, you can exit your studies at that point with a recognised qualification and skills relevant to the job market.

You may also have the opportunity to continue your degree level studies on a part-time basis. Contact us to discuss your options.

"I think that BA gives you the breadth of knowledge required to get into employment.




"When I was a primary school I was quiet and a bit timid, but I really enjoyed it. But somewhere between P3 and P5, I found out I was dyslexic.


