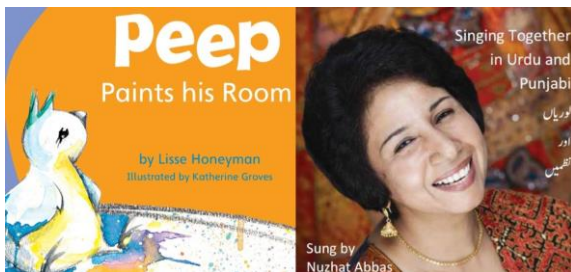

The **Learning Together Programme** is an effective way for practitioners to support:

- **parents and carers** to build positive attachment relationships with their babies and children
- **parents and carers** to make the most of everyday learning opportunities with their child – listening, talking, playing, singing and sharing books and stories together - enhancing their home learning environment
- **babies and children** to be confident learners – through playing, talking, singing and sharing books and stories – for a flying start in life and at school.

We train practitioners around the UK and beyond, to enhance their skills and understanding, and to use the Programme with parents/carers and young children. The training includes online access to the Programme and supporting resources.

Learning Together Programme

The Programme contains 74 child development topics covering five strands of learning, for trained practitioners to share with families:

- **Personal, social and emotional development**
- **Communication and language**
- **Early literacy**
- **Early maths**
- **Health and physical development**

Feedback from Peep parents:

- 'I've started to find time to play with my child.'
- 'It hadn't occurred to me to listen to him and give him space to talk.'
- 'I felt isolated but found Peep a lifeline.'

The Programme is structured but flexible:

- You can use it 1-to-1, in universal or targeted groups, in drop-in sessions or child health clinics, outdoors, in a school or nursery – wherever families spend time.
- Each topic relates to one or more of the developmental stages: babies, toddlers or pre-school.
- You can use any of the topics in any order.
- The Programme uses the ORIM framework (Opportunities, Recognition, Interaction, Modelling) developed by Professors Peter Hannon and Cathy Nutbrown.

Evidence base

A longitudinal evaluation of the Learning Together Programme, by the University of Oxford, found that Peep children made significantly greater progress in a set of literacy-related skills and had higher self-esteem, and Peep parents had an enhanced view of their parent-child interaction. The findings support other evidence that the home learning environment (i.e. what parents do with their children) has a positive impact on children's long-term outcomes.

The Learning Together Programme is being evaluated in a Randomised Controlled Trial funded by the Education Endowment Foundation.



Parent/carer qualifications

Parents & carers can gain nationally recognised units through our Peep Progression Pathway (SCQF credit-rated by SQA in Scotland and by NOCN in the rest of the UK), enhancing their confidence, understanding and employability.
