Please find an overview below of the areas they will be looking at this term. These are the overarching 'Learning Intentions' for the whole class for the term. #### **Learning:**

Reading	<ul> <li>This term we will be engaging with 'The Lighthouse Keeper' book series by David and Ronda Armitage.</li> <li>We are learning to read independently for up to 15 minutes (drop and read).</li> <li>We are learning to compare fact and opinion within written texts.</li> <li>We are learning to read our own writing out loud.</li> <li>We are continuing to practise phonics, recap and consolidate sounds and digraphs.</li> <li>We are continuing to learn to recognise common words and ORT keywords.</li> <li>We are learning to demonstrate some fluency in reading.</li> <li>We are learning to read aloud with expression.</li> <li>We are learning to read for pleasure and enjoyment through regular visits to the Bookery.</li> </ul>
Writing	<ul> <li>We are learning to write a Haiku poem.</li> <li>We are learning to write an invitation. Some children will use a frame for support.</li> <li>We are learning to write a list. Some children will learn to write a list using commas.</li> <li>Some children are learning to expand their use of vocabulary within their writing.</li> <li>We are learning to use phonetically plausible strategies to spell or attempt to spell unknown words.</li> <li>We are learning to correctly punctuate sentences using capital letters and full stops throughout our writing. Some children will learn to use questions marks, commas and exclamation marks where appropriate.</li> <li>We are learning to write letters mostly correct sized and spaced out correctly.</li> <li>We are learning to neatly present our writing i.e., writing on the line.</li> <li>We are learning to join sentences using a range of different conjunctions.</li> <li>Some children will use Clicker for writing support.</li> </ul>

Listening & Talking	<ul> <li>We are learning to ask and respond to different types of questions to show understanding of the main ideas of our class novel.</li> </ul>
	We are learning to compare facts and opinions in a set text.
	We are learning to plan and share information (spoken texts) to deliver.
	We are learning to with support, select and then use an appropriate resource to enhance communication when giving a talk i.e. objects, pictures
Numeracy	<ul> <li>We are learning to count in 2's, 5's and 10's (both forward and backwards). Some children will be learning to count in 3's and 4's (both forwards and backwards).</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Some children are learning number bonds and doubles to 20.</li> </ul>
	Some children are learning to add and subtract within 20. Some children are learning to add and subtract within 99 using the split strategy.
	<ul> <li>Some children will learn to use counting strategies to multiply a single digit by 2, 5 and 10.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Some children will be introduced to arrays and will learn to build, describe and count them.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>We are learning to identify, name and describe a variety of 2D and 3D shapes using the correct vocabulary (Mrs Hogben).</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>We are learning to explore why certain shapes fit together and can make a tiling pattern (Mrs Hogben).</li> <li>We are learning to recognise symmetry in pictures, patterns and the wider environment (Mrs Hogben).</li> </ul>
Social Studies	Our topic for this term is 'rescue at sea'.
	<ul> <li>We are learning to draw a short timeline and locate two or more consecutive events on it.</li> <li>We are learning to use information learned from sources to relate the story of a local place or individual of</li> </ul>
	historic interest through media such as drawings, models or writing.
	We are learning to draw comparisons between modern life and life from a time in the past.  We are learning to draw comparisons between modern life and life from a time in the past.
	<ul> <li>We are learning to name a figure from the past and comment on their role in events.</li> </ul>
RME	We are learning about the festivals of Diwali and Hanukkah.
	<ul> <li>Children in P2 will be learning about the story of Christmas and participating in the school nativity performance.</li> </ul>
Health & Wellbeing incl.	We are learning to be safe and mindful of others when using a hockey stick.
P.E.	<ul> <li>We are learning to control the direction, speed and accuracy of a ball when using a hockey stick</li> <li>We are learning how eating a balanced diet can help keep us healthy.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>We are learning to spot potential water hazards in different seasons and discuss how we can stay safe.</li> <li>We are learning to recognise and discuss the importance of water safety signs.</li> </ul>
	We are learning who to contact in case of an emergency.

	<ul> <li>We are learning about the importance of following our whole school values (ambition, kindness, equity, respect) through assemblies.</li> <li>Through the creation of 'Our Class Promise' we are learning about our rights and how these can help us to understand friendships, personal space and safety.</li> </ul>
Expressive Arts	We are learning to design a water safety poster.
(Music, Art and Drama)	<ul> <li>We are learning about the families in an orchestra and to identify the different types of instruments.</li> <li>We are learning to identify the features of a piece of music i.e. tempo, rhythm and dynamics.</li> <li>Children in P2 will be learning to use voice, movement and expression to perform in the school nativity.</li> <li>Children in P3 will be learning to participate and perform in the Christmas carol service.</li> </ul>
Digital Literacy/Technology	<ul> <li>We are learning to use search engines to search for specific keywords.</li> <li>We are learning to identify the differences between hardware and software.</li> <li>We are learning to use websites to support our learning such as Top Marks, Doorway Online, Sumdog.</li> <li>Some children will use clicker software to support and enhance learning.</li> </ul>
Science (with Mrs Hogben)	<ul> <li>We are learning about the Earth, sun and moon.</li> <li>We are learning how day, night and our seasons are controlled by the Earth's orbit and tilt.</li> <li>We are learning to observe and record the different phases of the moon.</li> </ul>
French (with Mrs Hogben)	<ul> <li>We are learning to respond to basic classroom instructions in French.</li> <li>We are learning to talk about different foods and animals including likes/dislikes.</li> <li>We are learning to use vocabulary about the weather.</li> </ul>
Outdoor Education	<ul> <li>We are learning to develop our teamwork, communication and exploration skills through weekly visits to the forest.</li> <li>We are learning to assess safe and unsafe situations and their effects on our wellbeing.</li> <li>We are learning to work collaboratively to complete numeracy activities outside.</li> </ul>
