Numeracy	We are learning about odd and even number sequences.

	• We are learning to use coins to different amounts up to 50p and work out change up to 20p		
	 We are learning about number doubles and near doubles. 		
	 We are learning to solve problems using addition and subtraction to 20. 		
	 We are learning to add and subtract numbers beyond 20. 		
	• We are learning how to compare and describe lengths, heights, mass and capacities.		
	• We are investigating the properties of 2D and 3D shapes.		
	• We are learning to use the language of direction (left, right , forwards and backwards).		
Social Studies /Science and	We are learning how the Egyptians lived in the past.		
RME	 We are making comparisons between past and present. 		
	 We are making links to the past by exploring items/images. 		
	 We are learning about the life and work of Robert Burns. 		
	 We are learning about common diseases caused by germs. 		
	 We are learning about the water cycle and the meaning of words evaporation, condensation and precipitation. 		
	 We are learning to carry out tests to find out what substances dissolve in water and can relate to real-life examples. 		

	 We are learning and becoming more aware of the importance of celebrations, festivals and customs in religious peoples' lives. Through music and drama, we are going to be becoming familiar with the beliefs of the world religions I am learning about.
Health & Wellbeing incl. P.E.	 We are learning and will perform a range of simple, repeated, intentional movements and gestures. (Scottish country dance) We are learning that dance consists of combined movements and gestures, usually performed with music or a beat. We are continuing to work on our stamina and when taking part in the daily mile. We are learning different techniques through gymnastics. We are becoming more aware of our feelings and are developing the ability to talk about them. We are learning that friendship, caring, sharing, fairness, equality and love are important in building positive relationships.
