## Minimising the risk of Covid-19 spread

As you know, we will be reviewing our control measures over the next four weeks. In the meantime, thank you for continuing to support our current measures:

- Come dressed for all weathers ventilation is a key strategy for keeping everyone safe. It can be quite cool indoors in school. We will be learning outdoors whenever we can
- Staggered arrival at school we have limited numbers in our cloakroom in the morning. Our doors are open from 8.55am – 9.15am so we don't have a squash and a squeeze
- Avoid congregating in the playground or at the gates please try to stay 2m apart
- Face coverings for adults in the playground and moving around the school building
- Regular handwashing for pupils and staff
- If anyone in your family is showing symptoms of Covid-19, please stay at home and book a PCR test.
- Limiting visitors to school. All visitors to school are by appointment only. Hand sanitizer should be used on entry to the building.

We encourage the children to bring a bottle of water each day. The children will bring their bottles home each night to be washed and should bring them into school filled the next morning. ### **WATER IN SCHOOLS - GUIDANCE FOR PARENTS**

Recent research has shown that many children are not drinking the recommended amount of fluids per day.

The Nutritional Requirements for Food and Drink in schools (Scotland) 2008 states that pupils must have access at all times to free, fresh drinking water. Water quenches thirst and does not damage teeth.

It is also advised that fruit juice is limited to meal times as frequent exposure can cause dental erosion which damages tooth enamel.

Therefore water bottles for use within class teaching time should only contain fresh drinking water

## Guidance for the use and care of bottles

- Bottles should be emptied and washed daily in hot soapy water (above 60°C) rinsed and left to air dry. Refer to manufactures guidance for cleaning.
- Bottles can be pre-filled each morning prior to leaving for school, to avoid unnecessary queuing at the water coolers. (Filled bottles can be stored in the fridge overnight to chill)
- All bottles should be named with a permanent marker.
- Only water is allowed in the bottles.
- Bottles will need to be replaced if they become damaged in any way.
