We've been encouraging everyone to walk, cycle, scoot and travel

actively to school. If you have to drive to school, please park further

away and stride to school. To support everyone cycling safely, Dr Bike visited on Friday 25th March.

Next term our pupils in P5-7 will be learning to cycle safely with Bikeability Scotland. Bikeability is designed to give children the skills and confidence they need to cycle safely on

the roads, and to encourage them to carry on cycling into adulthood.

Just like learning to swim, learning to cycle safely is an essential life skill. Scottish Government guidance encourages walking and cycling to school, and Bikeability Scotland supports outdoor learning.

Bikeability Scotland supports the next generation of confident and responsible road users. Transport is the single biggest source of climate change emissions and cycling helps reduce the impact on climate change and improves air quality.

Bikeability Scotland instructors play a hugely important role in getting kids into cycling, thereby encouraging them to choose a healthy, environmentally-friendly, and fun mode of transport. Would like an opportunity to learn how to become a Bikeability Instructor and inspire the next generation? You don't need to be a cycling expert to become an instructor. We will be running training for adults on 9th and 10th June. Look out for a letter coming out to parents soon.
