


COMMERCIAL PRIMARY SCHOOL Term 4 Class Newsletter for Primary 1





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## <u>Literacy</u>

### Reading

This term we will be sharing a range of stories and non-fiction books about Minibeasts. We will continue to use these books as our context for all of our literacy learning and we will do lots of activities which will develop our comprehension and reading skills.

We will all continue to practise reading our double sounds in words that we do not know. We will also focus on recognising more common words by sight.

Some of us will be discussing different types of punctuation that we see in our stories and what they are used for.

### Writing

We will continue to work on the presentation of our writing and forming our letters correctly, starting in the right place. We will be doing weekly handwriting sessions to practise this.

We will continue to use our sound knowledge to sound out words and sentences to make stories. We will be focusing on using capital letters and full stops independently. We will use connectives to make our sentences longer and adjectives to make our writing more interesting.

We will be looking at different text types, focusing on fact files and instruction writing. This will be linked to Minibeasts and DYW. (Developing the Young Workforce)

### Numeracy and Maths

### Numeracy

We will be introduced to the concept of place value to help us with our number recognition. We will look at how numbers can be made of tens and ones.

We will work on recalling doubles facts and using these to help us with near doubles such as 4+4=8 so 4+5=9. Numbers will increase for some.

We will continue to use our number knowledge to enhance our understanding of the concepts of addition and subtraction and we will continue to work on linking these two concepts together.

We will also be working on our number bonds to 10 and being able to work on the speed that we can recall them. E.g. 5 + 5, 6 + 4, 1 + 9.

We will also be learning to see patterns in numbers and count on in 2s,5,s and 10s.

### Maths

This term we will develop our understanding of money. We start with recognition of the coins we use in our country then we will look at making different values with the coins we have. We will also add different values together and then use our knowledge of subtraction to give change.

We will also be developing our understanding of fractions, understanding what a half looks like in different contexts, e.g. food and numbers.

Finally, we will develop our understanding of measurement. We will be using words like; heavy/light, long/short, full/empty to describe the weight, length and capacity of objects.

# Expressive Arts

In Drama we will be learning to peer assess others' work. We will learn how to talk about what we are learning and how we can improve next time.

In Music we will be learning about the difference between beat and rhythm and we will also learn some simple notation.

In Art we will explore the work of artists and use them to inspire our work in class. We will be learning about colour, how to mix new colours and how to use a paintbrush effectively.

### <u>RME</u>

We will be developing our understanding of Islam by learning about the festivals of Eid and Ramadan and how these are celebrated across the world. We will also be discussing how Muslims show care for one another.

We will also continue to learn about respecting others beliefs.
