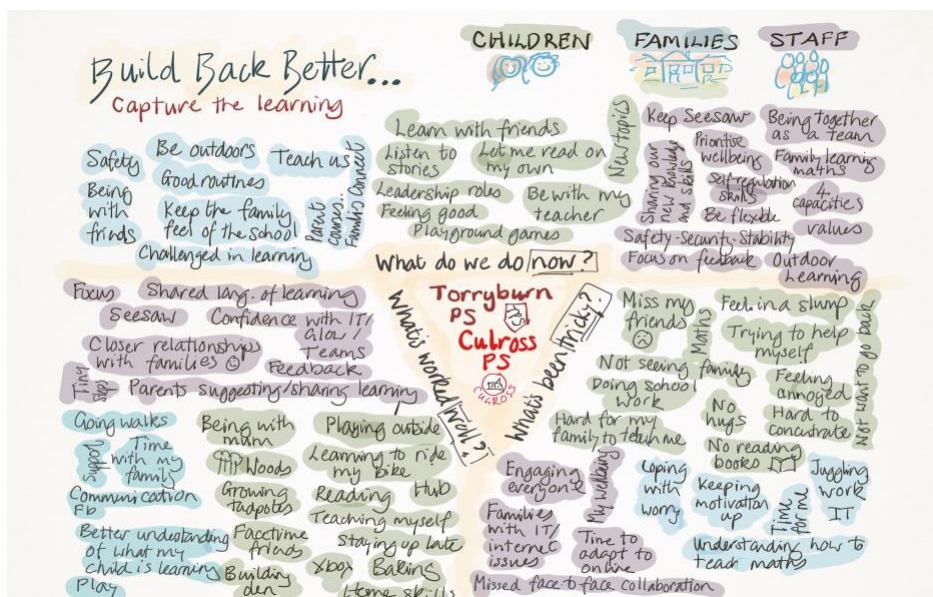

- Culross Primary School serves the area of Culross, Low Valleyfield and Shiresmill. We are situated in the small historic village of Culross on the River Forth.
- Our current role is 57 children, split across three composite and multi-composite classes, with almost half our children being placing requests.
- A new Headteacher is in post this session and the Senior Leadership Team is shared with Torryburn Primary School.
- Understanding what we need to improve across our school is based on our ongoing self-evaluation involving children, families and staff throughout session 2019-2020. In addition, during the month of June we extensively gathered the views of our children, families and staff to find out:
 1. What has worked well?
 2. What's been tricky and did anything help?
 3. What do we do now?

<p><u>Key Actions</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Develop school community knowledge and understanding of the 5 Ways to Wellbeing: Connect; Give; Take Notice; Be Active; Learn. • Establish a consistent approach to learning and teaching to support mental wellbeing of middle/upper school pupils, through using 'The Compassionate and Connected Classroom' curricular resource. • Provide families with information about 'The Compassionate and Connected Classroom' so they understand what is taught and why, giving them opportunities to ask questions and offer feedback. • Implement 'Being Cool in School' to support wellbeing of early years pupils. • All staff to engage in professional learning to further develop understanding of the impact of adversity and trauma and to provide support to help mitigate against the impact of these experiences. 	<p><u>Key Actions</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Engagement in professional learning to build capacity amongst staff in developing children's numeracy concepts and associated skills, focusing on: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Number and Number Processes ○ Fractions, Decimals, Percentages ○ Time ○ Data and analysis ○ Chance and uncertainty • Develop targeted support for individuals and small groups with mental maths focus. • Improve resourcing at Early Level. • Introduce new planning format to support staff understanding of progression in mathematics and numeracy. • Develop family learning support material showing progression of strategies in addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. • Implement 'Learn It' booklets to support home learning with mental maths. 	<p><u>Key Actions</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Introduce diagnostic assessments at each primary stage and at the end of a level for numeracy and mathematics. • Create a clear assessment calendar with a shared rationale and framework. • Improve teacher ownership and use of data to improve outcomes for all learners. • Introduce the York Assessment of Reading for Comprehension (Early Reading Assessment) to Primary 2 and Primary 3. • Introduce the York Assessment of Reading for Comprehension to Primary 5 and Primary 6. • Improve assessment in writing for all children across imaginative, functional and personal. • Create pupil friendly assessment sheets to support feedback and identification of next steps in writing.
