Leaflet for Parents

What are Together Times?

We are so excited to welcome our parents and carers into our classrooms. We really value the time that they can spend with their children. There are so many benefits:

- An opportunity to join their child in class and share in their learning.
- All children, staff, parents and carers are learning together.
- Children and adults are engaged in a variety of activities.
- Children, staff and parents will have the opportunity to talk and listen to each other.
- An opportunity to develop a partnership with parents and carers. It shows children that their school values the important link between home and school.
- It can give parents and carers ideas about how to extend their child's learning at home.

How are classes organised during Together Time?

- There will be a variety of activities that consolidate and extend children's learning.
- Children will be involved in working in groups and/or by themselves.
- Staff will have the opportunity to interact with children as well as to observe them.

What should you do?

- We are trying to limit numbers visiting our classes. This means that only one adult per child can attend Together Time and sadly we cannot accommodate younger siblings.
- We are aware that large numbers of adults in classes can be overwhelming for our learners so have planned two sessions for each of our Together Times. You will be asked to let the school know what suits you best.
- Enter via the office entrance and go straight to classes at the allotted time.
- Sign the register in your child's class.
- You will have an opportunity to get involved in your child's learning, however, you will not be asked to do anything that makes you feel uncomfortable.
- This is an informal opportunity to visit classrooms. It will be difficult for teachers to discuss your child's progress at these times. This can be done by contacting the school office.
