Information for Parents **SCHOOL UNIFORM**

As a school we want to instil a sense of pride in being part of the Dalgety Bay learning community and, therefore, seek to promote a smart and uniformed dress code which encourages a positive ethos and sense of belonging to the school.

We believe that wearing full school dress also promotes:

- self-discipline and the fostering of positive attitudes to school
- improved security within school and on excursions
- reduction in bullying and victimisation from peer pressure to wear branded items
- assistance for parents in terms of economic and practical issues

We hope that parents/carers will give full backing to the school in promoting the wearing of correct school uniform. All pupils should take a pride in identifying with the school. Expectations about student dress apply to attendance at sports fixtures and excursions organised by the school or where a pupil is representing the school.

At Dalgety Bay, we are a tie promoting school and would encourage all pupils to come to school wearing our school tie.

- P1-6 ties can be purchased via Ipayimpact.
- Elasticated ties are also available to purchase via Ipayimpact.
- Senior ties are kindly gifted by the PTA at the start of P7.



SCHOOL UNIFORM

We encourage children to wear the following, all of which should be non-branded.


- school tie
- white shirt/polo shirt
- plain navy cardigan/jumper/tank top
- navy or black skirts of an appropriate length/trousers/knee-length shorts/leggings
- navy pinafore/navy gingham summer dress
- navy/white/black socks or tights
- P7 Leavers' hoodies
- **plain black or dark** school shoes/boots/trainers



All tops can be worn with or without our school badge.

We would discourage children from wearing:

- hat/cap/scarves
- jeans of any colour/style
- coloured/hooded/zip tops
- brightly coloured tights
- coloured shoes/boots/trainers



We would appreciate your support in ensuring the correct items of school dress are worn daily.

All items of clothing should be clearly labelled with your child's name.

We would also be discouraging primary aged children arriving at school wearing:

- fake tan
- acrylic nails
- false eyelashes
- heavy make-up
- excessive jewellery

If smart watches are worn during the school day, please ensure these are switched to the appropriate setting e.g. school mode.

PE KIT

The Scottish Government recognises the positive impact physical education can have on a pupil's health, educational attainment, and life chances and that it can form a key element of a school's plan to deliver the broad health and wellbeing outcomes and experiences contained within Curriculum for Excellence.

This includes a commitment that every school pupil in Scotland will benefit from at least two hours per week of physical education in primary school. Children should come to school wearing their PE kit on appropriate days. We would appreciate your support in ensuring the following kit is worn:

- plain t-shirt
- navy/black shorts/cycling shorts/leggings/jogging bottoms
- plain jumper/sweatshirt/hooded top
- suitable footwear

Where possible, we would discourage:

- bright colours
- excessive branding, clothes with discreet logos are acceptable
- unsuitable footwear



Football strips, crop tops or hot pants should not be worn.

Moving into Term 2, we would encourage pupils to keep an indoor pair of shoes/trainers/plimsols in their school bags.
