STAFFING ALLOCATION FOR CLASSES

- Class formations are organised by Fife Council.

 This year the classes are to be arranged as follows:-
- Primary I 25 pupils
- Primary 2-3 30 pupils
- Primary 4-7 class 33 children
- Composite classes 25 pupils
- The classes are arranged by date of birth using the school's management information system

A COMPOSITE CLASS; WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

- A composite class is a formation of two or more stages.
- Composite classes are necessary because every school requires to make the best use of available resources.
- The minimum of pupils at each stage is 4.
- Stage partners will have the same opportunities follow same experiences and outcomes but not
 necessarily same topics or context.

- Primary 5/6– Miss Scobie in Room 7 7/17 pupils
- Primary 7 TBC in Room 6 31 pupils

CLASS FORMATIONS – WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR YOUR CHILD?

- Your child will continue to work at the from the same level he/she has been doing in their current class.
- The teacher will continue to provide a curriculum which meets the needs of the pupils according to their age and stage of development.
- This happens in all classes throughout the school. Teachers are skilled in teaching classes with a wide ability range.

TO GIVE AN EXAMPLE-

- If your child is in the current Primary One class and is reading O.R.T. Stage 4 books. When they go into Primary Two they will continue to read the next book in the Stage 4 series.
- If your child is in the current Primary One class and is going into the Primary 2/3 class the same would apply.
- Basically they will carry on where they left off in the last class.

WORKING TOGETHER

- Your child will continue to progress at his/her own level.
- Class teachers will continue to plan together and use the same teaching programmes for all classes next year.
- You will continue to have opportunities to join in with their learning

FRIENDSHIP GROUPS

- This is an excellent opportunity for your child to make new friendships in a new class as well as retaining the friends they have made this year. This is great for their social skills.
- Educational research suggests that pupils who have experienced mixed classes are more socially skilled
- Seating arrangements in class are not necessarily in friendship groups and the children's main opportunity to socialise with friends would be a break time and lunchtime.
