



How to set up on-screen keyboard with a different script

## How to set up on-screen keyboard with a different script


1. From the Windows menu open Settings.




2. Click on the Time and Language tile.




3. From the menu on the left-hand side pick Language.

5. In the Windows Search box type on-screen Keyboard and pick **On-Screen Keyboard App** and then OPEN.




6. When the menu shows on your screen go to the bottom right corner, click on the symbol of the language (ENG in most cases) and choose one of the installed languages.

- 7. Your On-Screen Keyboard (as well as your laptop's keyboard) will now type using the script of your chosen language.
  - Each language has a slightly different layout of the keyboard therefore using your laptop's keyboard for typing at this stage is not recommended



 Remember to change the language back to English after you have finished using the on-screen keyboard by going back to the bottom right corner and clicking on the symbol of the language (if your On-Screen Keyboard is set the to the Ukrainian language you will see the letter UK) and choosing English from the menu.
