

Resources to Support Educators with Conversations about Racism

The <u>Building Racial Literacy programme</u> (BRL) is run by Education Scotland and is part of the Scottish Government's <u>Anti-Racism in Education programme</u>. We support proactive conversations about racism rooted in empathy, listening, kindness and productive discomfort. You can see our <u>principles for safer, braver learning spaces</u> for more details. Educators who use these principles have found them very supportive in different settings.

BRL has been running since 2021 but recognises that, with recent news of riots, educators may be looking for more support with discussing racism and islamophobia with learners. We hope that some of the resources suggested below are helpful.

With young people being more exposed to news events through social media than ever before, many may be experiencing distress and anxiety. Some also may, sadly, be experiencing increased overt racism in public. Carefully managed, these discussions will provide safer spaces for all learners within their learning communities moving forward.
