Settling In

We appreciate the big step starting nursery is for your child and family. It may be the first time your child has been away from you for any length of time. We will work with you to support you and your child to settle into nursery and build positive relationships with staff and other children.

Parents/Carers are welcome to stay with their child in nursery to support them to settle in and build trusting relationships with staff. We will support you with this and take the lead from your child.

You and your child will visit nursery before their start date and be connected to SeeSaw, where our staff team will read stories and share information.

What are Personal Learning Journeys (PLJs)?


This a record of your child's learning at nursery.

When your child starts here, the keyworkers will tell you how you can contribute to the PLJ folder.

You will be invited to have parent chats, where you can hear about how your child has settled and how we can work together with your child to share successes and plan next steps for learning.

PLJs and Parent Chats are currently being supported online and through phone calls/discussions.

Home learning is supported through our SeeSaw.



Clothing

We would advise you to dress your child in old, comfortable clothes for coming to Nursery, so that they can run about easily and it won't matter if they get these covered in paint, glue or mud.

Please also bring a spare set of clothes to Nursery so we have a change of clothing should your child get wet in the water tray or have an accident. All clothing should be labelled with your child's name.

We recommend trainers, or boots/wellies for the winter, to allow the children to safely enjoy physical play outdoors. Indoor shoes are also welcome in your child's bag - especially when shoes and socks can become wet or muddy from outdoor play.

Please bring a coat for your child, as we try to get out to play even if the weather is not very good. Waterproofs are also recommended.



Nursery Snack

All children are offered a small snack during their session. This is normally something like fruit, toast, cheese & crackers with milk or water to drink.

Please let us know if your child has specific dietary requirements or allergies.



Lunch

For those children staying for lunch, these are free and a choice of hot or cold lunch is available. You can provide your child with their own packed lunch if you prefer. We follow 'Setting the Table' documentation.

Menus are shared with parents/carers to support choices.

Nursery Weekly Contribution

Voluntary contribution helps us to cover the cost of any additional snacks or consumables as well as cooking or baking activities and also goes a long way towards the cost of trips, outings & resources to support children's learning and experiences.

Suggested donation £2 per week.

Attendance

If your child is not attending Nursery due to illness, family days, holidays or appointments then please let us know as soon as possible by calling the main office 01383 602161 or messaging us on SeeSaw.

We are required to follow Fife Council procedures for all absences.

<u>Illness</u>


We encourage the children to practise good hand hygiene and infection control measures are followed by staff.

Should you feel your child has something contagious then please do not send them into Nursery and contact us to let us know why they are ill.

If your child has had sickness and/or diarrhoea, then they will not be fit to return to Nursery until 48 hours following their last bout. Infection control is at the back of this booklet.

Sun Awareness


We work a Sun Awareness policy at Halbeath that means we encourage our children to:

Wear a sunhat when outside.

Wear clothing covering the shoulders and arms. Be outside for limited periods when sunny between 11am and 3pm.

Wear appropriate sunscreen. Be encouraged to play in the shade and take frequent liquids.

Parents/carers please apply sun cream to your child prior to coming into nursery. Staff will reapply during the full day session with nursery sun cream. If your child has sensitive skin, you may wish to supply your own sunscreen. Please label the bottle clearly and speak to a staff member.



Accidents

If your child has a minor accident in nursery, we will treat them with any necessary first aid and advise you of the accident.

We keep a record of all accidents. Parents are asked to sign the record to confirm that they have been informed of the accident and can also have a copy of the form if they wish.

If a child has a major accident in our care, we will contact you and emergency services. Please make sure we have up-to-date contact details for both yourself and your emergency contact, in case we cannot reach you.

Progress Chats

Halbeath Nursery encourages parents to have regular contact with staff. Our staff are always happy to discuss how your child is getting on in nursery and we are available if you need some support or advice.

We will invite you to join us for progress meetings throughout your child's time at Halbeath Nursery, where your child's keyworker will discuss your child's progress in nursery. These meetings will be planned across the duration of your child's time in nursery.

We will be offering a mixture of face-to-face conversations, video calls, phone calls and posts on SeeSaw. Just let us know what will work best for you and your family.

If at any time you wish to discuss your child's time in nursery, you can make an appointment by contacting the nursery office.



<u>FareShare</u>

We have Fareshare which is available to all families and local community. Fareshare is a food waste charity that we work with to reduce food waste by encouraging families to take whatever food they can use.

Each week we get a food delivery from Fareshare for a small fee to the nursery. All parents are welcome to access Fareshare so please take what you need. If you can, you can leave a donation which will cover the cost of Fareshare with any extra used to purchase resources for our children in nursery.

We also have a children's clothing rail at nursery. This is to support us to reduce, reuse and recycle. If your child would benefit from an item of clothing from the rail, please help yourself. You can make a small donation for any item, but this is not necessary. We also welcome any donations of children's clothing for our clothing rail.



Stay and Play

You are welcome to stay and play for part of your child's session. This gives you the opportunity to share in your child's experiences.

We will invite you and your family to spend time in the nursery room with your child. This is a great opportunity for you to see how your child has been learning and developing in all areas.

We will have a monthly stay and play session which will be themed throughout the year and linked to the playroom planning.

It is fun and informal, and we always appreciate your ideas for activities too.

Lending Library

We have a lending library, and all children are invited to borrow books to take home and share. Our lending library supports children to be inspired to learn through play by exploring stories and developing a love for books. Children will have the opportunity to borrow a book every two weeks, you can return your book sooner if you wish. If your child is not in nursery on lending library day or they do not have their bookbag with them, they will be able to visit the lending library the next session they are in with their book bag.



Child Protection

We have a duty of care to the children we see, and we must make sure they are safe. The welfare of children is paramount to staff at Halbeath Nursery.

Should a child inform us or show signs that they are at risk from harm then we have a duty to report our concerns to either Social Work or Fife Police. This may be done without parental consent.



Infection Control

The information contained in the booklet was issued by the Department of Health and Department of Education.

Infection and Symptoms	Recommended Exclusion	Comments
Athletes foot	None	Not serious infection child should be treated.
Chicken Pox (Varicella Zoster)	Until all vesicles have crusted over (5 days).	Pregnant staff should seek advice from their GP if they have no history of having the illness.
Cold Sores (herpes simplex)	None	Avoid kissing and contact with the sores.
German Measles (rubella)	7 days before and 7 days after.	Preventable by vaccination (MMR x 2 doses). Pregnant staff should seek prompt advice from their GP.
Hand foot and mouth (coxsackie).	None	If a large number of children affected contact HPT. Exclusions may be considered in some cases.

Infection and Symptoms	Recommended Exclusion	Comments
Impetigo (Streptococcal Group A skin infections)	Until lesions are crusted or healed or 48 hours after starting antibiotics.	Antibiotics
Measles	4 days from onset of rash.	Preventable by vaccination (MMR x 2 doses). Pregnant staff should seek prompt advice from their GP.
Ringworm	Not usually required unless extensive.	Treatment is required.
Scabies	Until first treatment has been completed.	2 treatments are required including treatment for household and close contacts.
Scarlet fever.	Child can return 24 hours after starting appropriate antibiotic treatments.	Antibiotics treatment is recommended for the affected child.
Slapped cheek/fifth disease. Parovirus B19.	None (once rash has developed).	Pregnant contacts of o case should consult their GP.

Infection and Symptoms	Recommended Exclusion	Comments
Shingles.	Exclude only if rash is weeping and cannot be covered.	Can cause chickenpox in those who are not immune, ie have not had chickenpox. It is spread by very close contact and touch.
Warts and verrucue.	None.	Verrucae should be covered in swimming pools, gymnasiums and changing rooms
Diarrhoea and/or vomiting.	48 hours from last episode of diarrhoea or vomiting.	
E.coli 0157 STEC Typhoid and paratyphoid (enteric fever). Shigella (dysentery).	Should be excluded for 48hours from the last episode of diarrhoea for E. coli 0157. Further exclusion may be required for some children until they are no longer excreting. Exclusion is also variable for enteric fever and dysentery. HPT will advise.	Further exclusion is required for children aged 5 years or younger and those who have difficulty adhering to hygiene practices.

Infection and Symptoms	Recommended Exclusion	Comments
Cryptosporidiosis	Exclude for 48 hours from the last episode of diarrhoea.	Exclusion from swimming is advisable for 2 weeks after the diarrhoea has settled.
Flu (Influenza).	Until recovered.	If an outbreak/cluster occurs, consult your local HPT.
Tuberculosis.	Advised by HPT on individual cases.	Only pulmonary (lung) TB is infectious to others. Needs close, prolonged contact to spread.
Whooping cough (pertussis)	48 hours from starting antibiotic treatment or 21 days from onset of illness if no antibiotic treatment.	Preventable by vaccination. After treatment, non infectious coughing may continue for many weeks.
Conjunctivitis	None.	If an outbreak/cluster occurs, consult your local HPT.
Diphtheria	Exclusion is essential. Always consult your local HPT.	Family contacts must be excluded until cleared to return by your local HPT. Preventable by vaccination.
Glandular fever.	None.	

Infection and Symptoms	Recommended Exclusion	Comments
Head lice.	None.	Treatment is recommended only in cases where live lice have been seen.
Hepatitis A.	Exclude until 7 days after onset of jaundice (or 7 days after symptom onset if no jaundice).	
Hepatitis B, C, HIV/AIDS.	None.	Hepatitis B and C and HIV are bloodborne viruses that are not infectious through casual contact.
Meningococcal meningitis\septicaemia.	Until recovered.	Meningitis ACVVY and B are preventable by vaccination. There is no reason to exclude siblings or other close contacts of a case.
Meningitis due to other bacteria.	Until recovered.	Hib and pneumococcal meningitis are preventable by vaccination. There is no reason to exclude siblings or other close contacts of a case.

Infection and Symptoms	Recommended Exclusion	Comments
Meningitis viral.	None.	Milder Illness. There is no reason to exclude siblings and close contacts of a case. Contact tracing is not required.
MRSA.	None.	Good hand hygiene and enviromental cleaning.
Mumps.	Exclude child for 5 days after onset of swelling.	Preventable by vaccination (MMR x2 doses).
Threadworms.	None.	Treatment is recommended for the child and household contacts.
Tonsillitis.	None.	There are many cases are due to viruses and do not need an antibiotic.
