This week in P4/5/6 we have been making posters about John Muir's life. We have been reding for information and we have used this in our own words to write about John Muir. Some interesting things we found out are; he walked a 1000 miles from Wisconsin to Florida after a tool he was using struck his eye and made him temporarily blind. We think, when he recovered and did the walk, he wanted to see more nature. He helped to make the first National Parks and he is famous for being kind to animals and nature.

We have been working on our ball skills in PE. This week we developed our throwing, catching, dribbling and shooting skills for basketball. To be successful in catching put one foot behind and have your hands ready in a W shape. For throwing, put one foot forward and bend your knee. We have also been improving our rounders skills.
