School Update

We have been incredibly busy this term. We have recently started a few sessions up at Ring farm in their amazing play barn. This is to give some pupils the opportunity to have a bigger safe place for PE and being active. Previously this year green class accessed 2 terms at the Tin Shed and Purple class has 2 terms at soft play. This time blue and orange have the chance to go. Meanwhile we are continuing swimming for specific pupils. We also have another chance for 4 pupils to access RDA this session, those who were planned to go but the sessions were cancelled earlier this year, will be heading off to the horses.

Summer Works

We had an exciting visit this week from Quaker and Colorado who are about to begin phase 2 of their support. This time Colorado will do some ground works to create a base for a large metal storage shed purchased by Quaker and create a path to our new wheelchair swing also purchased by Quaker. This work is likely to take place in the summer and will be ready to house our brand-new wheelchair bike and existing bikes and trikes. We cannot wait! We are also delighted to be getting a new food preparation area, height adjustable sink and kitchen cabinets in purple class over the summer. This will also include additional sinks for staff and a dishwasher. We have also purchased a dishwasher for the action zone which means the whole school can practice their life skills and help with hygiene.
