Literacy	Reading <i>Our class novel is 'The Explorer'</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We are developing skills and strategies to help us read and understand texts. In particular we will be learning to find information in non-fiction texts using headings, subheadings and diagrams. • We will use these skills to answer 'Literacy Key' tasks: the focus of our learning this term will be finding information in non-fiction texts using skimming, scanning and the Contents and Index pages, identifying the main idea of a text, and distinguishing between fact and opinion. • We are learning to extend our vocabulary by finding out the meaning of words linked to our reading, spelling and social studies learning and developing our use of a thesaurus to find synonyms and antonyms. • We are learning to ask and answer literal, inferential and evaluative questions about a text.
	Writing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We are learning to create functional texts, focusing on persuasive texts and fact files. • We are learning to take notes, using headings and graphic organisers to help us. • We are learning to edit, proof-read and up-level our writing. • We are learning to apply our ongoing spelling work to all areas of literacy. • In Grammar we are learning about the Parts of Speech, openers and conjunctions and plurals. • We are extending our vocabulary through learning about synonyms and antonyms. • We are developing our use of 'Tier 2' vocabulary through QI Writing.

	Listening & Talking	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We are learning to take part in discussion; listening, asking questions and sharing our ideas. • We are learning to discern between fact and opinion. • We are learning to identify the purpose and main idea of a text.
Numeracy		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We are learning to use a variety of mental and written addition and subtraction strategies, and to apply them to word problems. • We are developing our knowledge of the multiplication tables. • We are learning mental and (some pupils) written strategies for multiplication and division. • We are learning about multiples of a number. • We are continuing to use Sumdog to improve our mental maths fluency at our own level. • We are continuing to develop our fluency and speed in mental calculations. • We are learning about the properties of 2D shapes and 3D objects.
Social Studies	We will finish our rainforest topic during the first part of term, then base our topic learning around The Theatre in the latter part of term.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We are learning about the impact of deforestation and logging in the rainforest. • We are learning to discuss the environmental impact of human activity, and ways we can live in a more environmentally responsible way. • We are learning about local and imported foods, and factors that may influence our food choices.
RME		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We are learning to investigate, describe and explain the key beliefs, celebrations, pilgrimages, and places of worship in Islam. • We are learning about the celebration of Christmas, and why it is important to Christians.
Science & Technology		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We are continuing our learning about sustainability and how lifestyles and land use can impact habitats as we finish our rainforest topic.
Health & Wellbeing, including PE		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We are developing our fitness through circuits. • We are developing our movement skills and control through creative dance. • We are learning ball skills- passing, receiving, shooting, marking and interception- through the sports of basketball and hockey. • We are developing our teamwork skills, good communication and showcasing good sportsmanship. • We are learning to reflect on our work to help us improve our performance. • We are learning about safety during the dark winter nights, at bonfire night and online. • We are developing our understanding of friendship and how to recognise and respond to bullying.

We are learning to communicate ideas through drama, and are developing our confidence presenting drama. We are learning to respond to drama and give and accept constructive comment. <p>We are learning about Theatre</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> We will learn about careers and roles within the theatre, both on stage and in marketing/ managing/ special effects as part of our Christmas show preparation.
